Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.	Para 1.20	At the end of the reporting year the Charity had 201 individual members (83 individual/59 double memberships). Eleven events were held during the reporting year ranging from in-gallery curator talks and tours, a number of lectures and a joint event with Liverpool John Moores University. A total of 657 participants attended these events, raising an additional £9,461 income for the charity in addition to the annual membership fees of £4,000* The income raised from the number of events allowed the charity to increase the level of grants available in its fourth year since achieving charitable status.

Financial Review

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	For the Charity's fourth reporting year (to 31 December 2024) income raised was £20,850 through membership subscriptions, events income and additional donations. Six grants amounting to £16,440 – a 64% increase on the amount given in 2023 - were made in May 2024 to regional arts organisations who made an application to the Charity. Projects supported included an artist residency, primary school group access to theatre, relabelling of art works and a public programme to support an exhibition. Expenditure is kept to an absolute minimum with £697 spent on insurance premiums and costs for website updates and e-newsletter generation.
Statement explaining the policy for holding reserves stating why they are held	Para 1.22	Reserves are held to enable the Charity to provide grants to a range of arts organisations across the Merseyside area.
Amount of reserves held	Para 1.22	At the end of the reporting year our Reserves were £22,393. This includes £7,585 of restricted funds from the residual of a previous received grant. This grant is available to put towards raising the profile of the Charity through holding events to help increase membership numbers.

We also run events for members and non-members to attend, in line with our Objects to raise funds. We also seek donations to help provide additional income to add to grant reserves.

A description of the principal risks facing the charity	Para 1.46	Main risk would be a reduction in the number of people wishing to support the Charity so a drop in income from which to be able to offer grants to arts organisation. The increase of online payments for many of the organised events and membership payments has resulted in a drop of additional donations. A further risk would be an inability to recruit new Trustees to help manage and run the Charity, particularly event organising. Insurance is paid for to cover any losses suffered during organised events.

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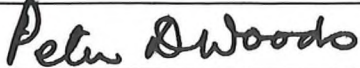
