Para 1.20	Our biggest charity donation this year was to the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), which helps improve peoples' lives around the world, from combating vision problems to responding to major catastrophes to providing valuable life skills to youth to raise funds for charity. We also made donations to the following: - Brain Tumour Research - Young Carers - Balls for All We were successful again in the Young Ambassadors Competition, which resulted in a £500 prize for Destiny, an Essex-based teenager who provides hospital packs for families in her project Sonny's Army. Our previous Young Ambassadors District winner also won at the National competition which resulted in a £1000 prize for Ellie-Mae to deliver CPD for St John's Ambulance cadets in Suffolk based on knife crime, education, support systems and treatment. Club members were also actively locally involved in activities such as food bank collections, gleaning, knitting clothing for premature babies and helping other Clubs with their Santa's Sleigh collections.
