We continued to work with previous Young Ambassador winner Ashton, providing tools to help with his project. One member of the club continues to make bird boxes and we sold these throughout the year. Several members knit various items for charity, such as clothing for premature babies A set of Wild Tribe educational books were donated to a school. As usual, we supported several other Lions clubs with their activities and got involved with some gleaning days. Our club organised District Convention for the second year running which took some attention away from our usual fundraising and service activities.
