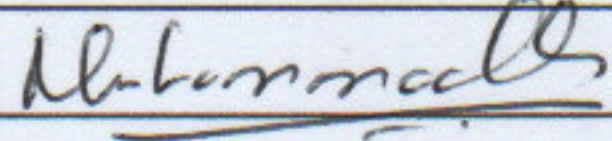

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

During the period, the charity secured income of £60,463 which comprised of restricted donations (£10,330). During the period, the charity had expenditure of £68,199 and loans repaid of £10,000 and return of a donation of £1,000. At the end of the period, the charity generated a deficit of £18,736 which was met with prior year surplus. The charity had restricted reserves of £23,792 and unrestricted reserves of £59,241.

The trustees have a policy to retain £1,000 in unrestricted reserves for governance and administration costs of the charity and remainder of the funds to be used for charitable activity in the future including the purchase of a property for charitable activity.
