During the period, the charity secured income of £48,333 which included restricted donations of £3,505. During the period, the charity had expenditure of £48,126. At the end of the period, the charity generated a surplus of £207 which was added to prior year surpluses. The charity had restricted reserves of £23,792 and unrestricted reserves of £52,687.

The trustees have a policy to retain £1,000 in unrestricted reserves for governance and administration costs of the charity and remainder of the funds to be used for charitable activity in the future including the purchase of a property for charitable activity.
