The Yamani Project is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) governed by its constitution. The trustees oversee the overall strategic direction, governance and financial stewardship of the charity. They are appointed in accordance with its constitution.

The charity's main objective is the relief of poverty in Formaya Village, Bonth District, Sierra Leone. The charity focuses on developing sustainable programmes aimed at supporting disadvantaged women and children.

4. Public benefit statement

The trustees confirm that they have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when planning the work of the charity.

5. Achievements and performance

During the year, The Yamani Project continued to strengthen engagement with community leaders in Formaya Village, despite difficult economic conditions in Sierra Leone. Economic hardship continues to impact livelihoods, making the charity's support increasingly vital.

Although fundraising remained challenging, the charity maintained its commitment to delivering sustainable initiatives focused on women's empowerment and children's welfare.

6. Financial review

The small surplus reflects necessary administrative and programme-planning costs. Reserves remain modest but appropriate for the charity's scale.

Key risks include economic instability in Sierra Leone, rising operating costs, and limited funding opportunities. Trustees continue to monitor and manage these risks through careful financial oversight and prioritisation of sustainable activities.

8. Plans for future periods

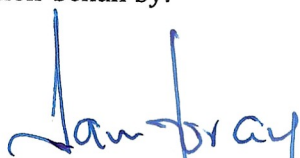
The charity plans to expand livelihood initiatives for women, support children's welfare programmes, and strengthen local partnership structures to ensure long-term sustainability.
