- supported schooling of 29 students at primary and secondary levels, and 5 university students supported
- provided hardship grants to the needy and supported 100 widows with grants for basic necessities

- supported 5 refugees for eye surgery for cataracts

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Brief statement of the charity’s policy on reserves	The charity secured donations of £157,945 (2023:£118,679) and had expenditure of £148,992 (2023:£135,840) of which the majority was grants of £142,661 for the year. This generated a surplus of £8,953. Total funds held at the end of the period was £10,541 which will be used for future charitable expenditure. The trustees have a policy not to hold reserves beyond using the surplus for future expenditure.
