Anglican Futures provided pastoral and practical support to faithful Anglican leaders and other members of the public who took part in our Ideas Exchanges.

We did this by providing analysis of present and future matters of interest on our blog www.anglicanfutures.org/blog; offering online Ideas Exchanges enabling discussion of different topics; a regular online coffee room and regular emails to subscribers.

We have offered pastoral support to those facing difficulties in the church context, including bullying, disciplinary proceedings and loneliness of leading small churches.

We have offered practical support to church leaders seeking advice on change management, starting up charitable structures and many different aspects of church life.

In all these activities the trustees have had regard to the guidance issues by the Charity Commission on public benefit. All our activities are advertised on our website.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Our subscriber list increased by 20% during 2022 - we sent 25 emails - with an average opening rate of about 70%.

Our blog, which offers analysis for, and practical support to, faithful Anglicans more than doubled in reach – with over 16,000 reads. Part of this was enabled by our presence in Canterbury during the Lambeth Conference – giving us the opportunity to engage directly with bishops from all over the world and therefore offer a global perspective on Anglican events.

As churches came out of lockdown, attendance at our online Ideas Exchanges reduced – we ran four events with an average attendance of twenty-two people. Our focus therefore moved towards supporting a regular Ministry in Deprived Areas online group and regular Coffee times and online prayer meetings have also provided pastoral support for lay and ordained leaders. We organised an in person gathering in September which allowed for more in-depth support and teaching to a small group.

We continued to offer support to clergy and congregations who have sought help with a range of questions including managing change, disciplinary proceedings and creating new charitable structures.
