Para 1.20	This is our fourth year as a newly formed church with CIO status. We continue to make good use of a rented church building at the Calon Lan centre (also known as Mynyddbach Chapel), holding regular Sunday morning services open to all and a Sunday School and free refreshments afterwards as well as a Christmas carol service and a fund raising craft evening. We have also rented a room at the Mercure hotel for monthly prayer meetings. We have been able to continue to employ a full time Pastor and are slowly building our reserves to enable us to acquire our own premises in the future. We currently have 29 members and average attendance at our Sunday service is 30-35 people. All our services are recorded and streamed online to any that may want to watch, and our Pastor also records and produces regular series of short Youtube videos, again freely available. We have been able to provide financial support to missionaries in India and Ukraine as well as supporting the Swansea Christian bookshop and Teach Beyond, and send aid to those in need of emergency assistance via the Barnabus Fund and the Slavic Gospel Assosiation. We also undertake monthly visits to a local care home, sharing the gospel and singing hymns.

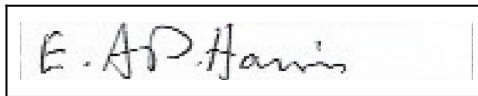
