No trustee received any remuneration nor reimbursed any expenses in the year under review.

During the period under review Coutts & Co, a trustee of the charity from inception to July 2021, were paid fees for the provision of administration and investment management services amounting to £7,721 with an additional £4,200 for setting up the trust until retirement. Ludlow Trust Company Limited were appointed trustee in July 2021 and charged fees for administrative services in the period amount to £5,025. These fees are authorised under clause 6 of the trust deed.
