Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	Para 1.17	For the public benefit, the prevention or relief of poverty in impoverished areas in the world, in particular, but not exclusively, in Hyderabad and surrounding areas by providing or assisting in the provision of grants and essential household items, education, training, healthcare projects and all the necessary support designed to enable individuals to generate a sustainable income and be self-sufficient.

Education/ Training: This has been one of the key areas where Maahir charity has focused on since its early days- as outlined in our governance document. A) In Hyderabad, India: We have continued the earlier work on providing help and guidance for medical students in India who are preparing for the PLAB exam – for medical graduates seeking to come to UK for training and jobs within the NHS. In addition to this we have, as part of our community get together event in Manchester (June 2024), invited a speaker from the Rahmani foundation (https://rahmanischoolofexcellence.org/) to increase awareness among people associated with the Maahir group in UK about challenges with access to quality education in India. The speaker highlighted the steps taken by Rahmani foundation to address the challenges and inspired people to actively participate in the foundation's activities. B) In UK: As in the last year for new migrants to UK there have been mentors identified among established professionals in different fields who have guided the new migrants in various ways including CV writing, specific training programs enrolment and interview practice.

		2. Advancement of Health or Saving of Lives: This has been one of the key areas where Maahir charity has focused on since its early days- as outlined in our governance document. In this year (2024-2025), there have been funds used for 2 separate individuals in need. The first one in April was for help with hospital expenses (£1000.00) for cancer treatment for a child and the second one was for hospital expenses (£1000.00) for a person who needed surgical treatment and rehabilitation after extensive trauma. 3. Community development and Diversity promotion: In UK: In June 2024 there was a social/cultural event organised in Manchester. In this event a large number of families (about 400 adults and children) gathered for socialising over dinner and a series of cultural events (quiz, poetry, literary competitions) were organised. Prior to this event there were a series of cricket matches organised between regional teams across England as part of the sports and fitness promotion plan from Maahir group. These were keenly contested games with a team from Manchester eventually being crowned as the cricket league champion. On the day of the cultural event, we had motivational speakers plus prize distribution for the winning individuals and teams. 4. Help in relief of poverty: We have collaborated with an active charity group in India- the Zakat Foundation India (https://zakatindia.org.uk/). This group shares the same ethos as Maahir with its focus on 'critical humanitarian aid campaigns and programs throughout India, concentrating on Orphan Care, Education for deprived children, the establishment of free health and wellness clinics, particularly focused on women's care, and Food Security'. A fundraiser was organised for this organisation and money transferred for use across India by the Zakat Foundation group.
