Trustees' Annual Report for 2023

About Caring Kits for Kids

Caring Kits for Kids was incorporated as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) in 2021 with the aim of fundraising and putting together backpacks for children and young people entering emergency foster care via A&E and for mothers fleeing situations of domestic abuse and human trafficking.

Our kits for children and young people entering emergency foster care contain a change of clothes, toiletries, a mental health resource from the NSPCC and comforts such as a book and a cuddly toy. The kits are designed to provide dignity and comfort to children and young people at an uncertain time and ensure they arrive in emergency foster care with more than just the clothes they are wearing¹.

Our kits for expectant mothers fleeing situations of domestic abuse and human trafficking contain a change of clothes, toiletries, a book, a notepad and pen, a cuddly toy and a drinks bottle.

Caring Kits for Kids' principal address is 3 Swaythling Road, West End, Southampton, SO30 3AE.

Caring Kits for Kids had at the end of 2023 and continues to have four trustees: Mark Houghton MBE, Dr Gayle Hann, Rebecca Taylor and Kalina Bolingbroke.

Kalina Bolingbroke was formally appointed as a trustee on 4 October 2023, following a unanimous vote by the Board of Trustees in September 2023.

2023 Year in Review

2023 has been a time of turmoil for a large proportion of the population, despite reducing inflation rates², the cost of living crisis continues to bite. The number of 'children looked after' in England (including adoptions) on 31 March 2023 stands at 83,840 – up 2% on 2022³. This suggests that the level of help needed to support those going into foster care remains high.

Caring Kits for Kids' response as a charity has been to continue to reach out to hospitals in need of support for their patients, continue to field requests for kits through the website and continue to work with existing contacts local to our hospitals.

Each request is considered on its own merits and action is taken wherever possible. This year, 5 requests resulted in 81 kits being delivered to hospitals in Ipswich, Worthing, Chichester, Derby, Tottenham and Tooting in London. Among the requests were debut deliveries to Ipswich Hospital in February, St Richard's Hospital and Worthing Hospital in July and Royal Derby Hospital in November.

Deliveries to St Richard's Hospital and Worthing Hospital would not have been possible without the tireless efforts of the Chichester Lions Club.

Caring Kits for Kids would also like to express its heartfelt thanks to Alstom. Funding the company provided for Derby, in combination with every penny fundraised by employees, continued this year to be vital to Caring Kits for Kids' ongoing mission. Of course equally appreciated are the invaluable hours that volunteers, including those from Alstom, have chosen to dedicate to helping us shop, pack and deliver our kits.

Caring Kits for Kids was also thrilled this year to welcome Kalina Bolingbroke to its Board of Trustees. Prior to becoming a trustee, Kalina had already led deliveries for the charity of 24 kits to North Middlesex University Hospital and 24 kits to St George's University Hospital. In September, Kalina also helped raise over £1300 at coffee mornings in Alstom depots for the charity.

Under Tesco's Community Grant scheme, operations in both Birmingham and Ipswich were guaranteed £500 each; this was announced in April and November respectively. We are enormously appreciative as this equates to the cost of roughly 10 kits.

2023 Financial Review

Trustees have received regular reports this past year on the charity's financial position and have had regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

In 2023, Caring Kits for Kids' income increased by £2281 from £3171 to £5452, expenditure increased by £933 from £3795 in 2022 to £4728 in 2023. Materials spending accounted for £4670 of all expenditure. At the end of 2022, Caring Kits for Kids had £5787 at the bank, with a reserves level of £1000.

In December 2023, the rate of inflation in the United Kingdom was 4.2% compared to 9.2% in December 2022 and 4.0% in December 2021. Whilst inflation levels are decreasing, it is likely the rising cost of goods will continue to remain a risk factor to the charity in 2024.

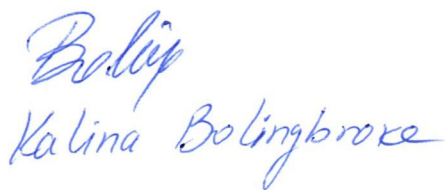
Going forward in 2024, [risk] and [risk] are the two biggest financial risks the charity faces.

Caring Kits for Kids' day-to-day operating costs continue to remain low, thanks in part to nonprofit offerings from Google, BT, Salesforce and Microsoft.

In 2023, Caring Kits for Kids diversified its income with £3425 coming from grants.

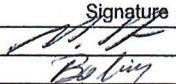
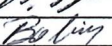
