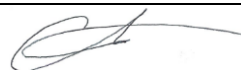

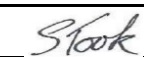

Our first period has consisted of developing links with other charities, and law firms who are willing to support us with pro bono services, developing our training offer for parents/carers to empower them to understand more about the Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP) process and about the assessment of different types of Special Educational Needs (SEN), and developing our areas of research interest, with our current project researching on misdiagnosis of needs.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Our training has assisted families who did not know anything about the support their children are entitled to, to understand their rights and needs. Understand what they need to do to obtain this, and sign post to other charities that can offer support as they progress with appeals to the SENDIST tribunal. This has resulted in several children obtaining a range of specialist provision who are now thriving.

Our misdiagnosis project is not yet complete but we have so far assisted with identification of several children's real SEN needs. This has enabled appropriate support to be put in place at school.
