There has been no change to the governance and governing document of the charity. Trustees will be recruited in accordance with our governing document. When a trustee steps down we will invite applications to the board and the existing trustees will create a selection process based on application and interview.

As expected, this has been another very challenging year with the impact of COVID not being allowed to recover before the Cost of Living crisis began to bite. Not only did we see a downturn in theatre attendance and a willingness to take risks but there is also a tendency to book all events last minute. We again took prudent action by cancelling our more risky activities and focussing on keeping the core going. Last year we reported that we had received a grant from WCC to improve the energy efficiency of our touring activities by replacing old equipment. That money has now been spent and the new energy efficient equipment is being used and reducing our carbon footprint. In September we began working with a consortium of key artists in a large-scale arts council bid, partnering with Imagineer productions, Artichoke, Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough Council. This bid was submitted in November and in January we learnt that the bid had been successful. SIPC bid came to approximately £86,000 and would be used to create three pieces of performance art based on a six-month process of community engagement. Although the funding is now in place it will not start to arrive in our account until the financial year 2023 / 2024.

This Arts Council Grant is a recognition of the work we do in the community as well as a response to the local authority being a priority area for the Arts Council. Working closely with the GRIT Art Collective, Imagineer and others together with both Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough Council and Warwickshire County Council puts us in a strong position moving forward. We expect to be strengthening these partnerships in the coming year leading to more funding and project activities. It has been a difficult period of limited activity but our decision to cut back on risky activities has ensured we are in a strong position as the climate changes.
