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Report of the Trustees
for the Year Ended 31 December 2024

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the period 1 to 31 December 2024. The trustees have adopted the Receipts and Payments Accounts method of presenting the financial report.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the charity are: The relief of those in need in the Philippines and the UK who are and have been impacted by natural disasters, global health crisis and poverty, through the provision of grants, funding and the distribution of essential items, such as food, clothing, hygiene items and educational support.

Public benefit

In planning our activities, the trustees keep in mind the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit at their trustee meetings. In view of the charity's objectives to provide relief, the work of the charity has continued to operate in accordance with these aims, seeking to promote public benefit through the charity's activities.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The charity has had regular communications with the supporter base through social media and via the charity's website www.heartforphilippines.org.

Zobel Starritt has worked closely with the local Filipino community to raise awareness of needs and to raise finances to support projects in the Philippines.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Investment policy and objectives

The charity continues to function successfully. The charity has raised funds from generous donors and these funds have been disbursed successfully to make significant progress with its objectives.

Reserves policy

With minimal costs in running the UK Charity the trustees consider that the charity's funds can be fully utilised for urgent projects in the Philippines. However, it is recognised that having a small buffer allows for an instant response to natural disasters before fund raising starts to provide for the project funding. The funds carried forward into 2025 of £2,239.84 is viewed as sufficient.

FUTURE PLANS

The trustees intend to continue focussing on developing good relationships with the local Filipino community in the UK. The charity will also develop new and innovative ways of using the modest finances and other means to support the projects in the Philippines.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is a CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation) controlled by its constitution registered on 18th March 2021.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Trustees are recruited as needed from a diverse number of backgrounds. Each trustee has relevant experience and a wide skills base which they bring to their service. In the event of particular skills being lost due to retirements, individuals are approached to offer themselves for election to the board of trustees. They are then invited to attend the next board meeting as an observer. They are then given time to consider prayerfully their willingness to stand for election. They are elected to the board of trustees by a vote taken by the existing trustees.

Organisational structure

The charity has a board of trustees comprising three trustees. The trustees are responsible for the strategic direction and policy of the charity and have control of the charity and its property and funds. Existing trustees may appoint additional trustees to their number, at any time, providing the total number of trustees is a minimum number of three and a maximum number of six individuals.

Induction and training of new trustees

Once trustees are appointed, time is taken to familiarise them with the practices and requirements relating to them as trustees. They are also made familiar with all aspects of the charity's work and financial situation. Any further training or induction takes place as the need arises.
