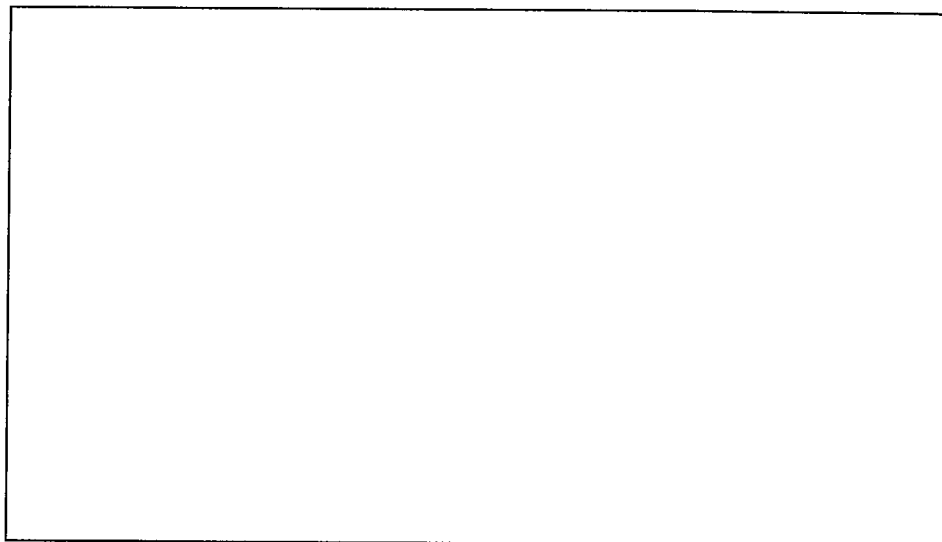

The trustees apply the funds of The Quamina Osei-Tutu Foundation at their discretion and in accordance with the charitable purposes and objectives of the charity. The trustees will consider the distribution of beneficial grants and make a decision in accordance with the charitable purposes and objectives.

The charity is initially to be funded by contributions from one of the trustee's companies, being Buadu Limited, A.C Sika Limited or Buadu Corp Ltd. The money will be held in a charity bank account for the purposes of awarding grants and undertaking projects in line with the charitable purpose.

In awarding grants, the trustees will apply the following principles;

The trustees will consider any requests or known situations that are eligible for consideration:

- Based on the location meeting the charitable objectives
- From individuals who meet the criteria within the charitable objectives
- From organisations that have a track record of delivering projects of the type of nature that are being considered for a grant
- Grants and projects should represent good value for money i.e. compare well in terms of impact per £1 spent compared to other grants/projects that are being or might be considered

Each request or situation will be considered on its own merits. Where situations have been previously considered (whether successful or not) any due diligence undertaken to reach an earlier decision will be made available to the trustees.

The trustees will carry out sufficient due diligence to ensure that the request or situation meets both the charitable purposes, and the priorities for support set out in this policy.

The trustees are content to work in partnership with other grant making bodies where funding of an entire project is beyond the scope of any single organisation.

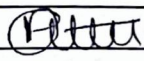
