The object of the CIO is for the benefit of the public : to relieve the needs of children and young people with autism spectrum disorder, epilepsy, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), their families/carers (the beneficiaries) in England and Wales in particular, but not exclusively, by the provision of: one to one sessions and workshop sessions that the beneficiaries can attend to discuss and share their issues with others, in similar situations, in a welcoming setting where people will feel more at ease. referrals to appropriate institutions where specific needs can be taken care of.

The trustees' policy is to ensure that the above aims are met to the highest possible standard.

Volunteers staff the charity, with the workload spread among some of the senior members.

The charity is funded by the general public and grant funders which is been used towards the maintenance and improvement of the charity's assets and promoting and achieving the charity's objects

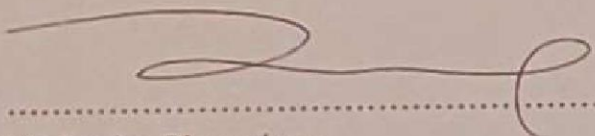
ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

1. 217 Parent/Carers attended one to one tailored support and workshops, delivered at our hired premises held 4 times weekly. These workshops were delivered face to face by professionals, trustees and volunteer who had undergone training programmes on autism spectrum disorder, epilepsy, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) awareness.
2. The Positive feedback we got from Parents. Carers and other beneficiaries regarding our service was very encouraging. Out of the 217 that attended, 119 attended at least 3 times a week and 183 at least once a week.
3. The public voluntary donation increased 520% from the previous financial year.
4. We received grant funds from Ground work changing lives, Manchester Wellbeing fund, Manchester community fund and Magic little grant.
5. We have 28 applications from people who want to volunteer their services for the organisation.
