REUNITING BY TRANSPORTING IN THE CHARITY VAN IN CRATES WHEN REQUIRED. STUDYING/COLLATING WITNESS STATEMENTS, AND FOOTAGE TO PROVE PET THEFT-WORKING ALONGSIDE POLICE, AND RECOVERING STOLEN ANIMALS. ONGOING SUPPORT AND REHABILITATION, VET CARE/FINANCIAL SUPPORT, BEHAVIOURISTS, FLEA/WORM/NEUTERING HELP. ASSISTANCE WITH PRIVATE CREMATION OF DECEASED PETS. BREAKING CRIME RINGS OF PET THEFT, ILLEGAL BREEDING, PUPPY FARMING, RURAL CRIMES INCLUDING DOG FIGHTING, BAITING, LAMPING, COURSING AND WILDLIFE CRIME.
