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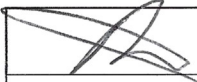

A monthly craft evening for women, providing a safe, creative environment for fun and friendship.

The King's Kitchen

We provide a monthly free Sunday lunch at the Greyfriars activity Centre. Numbers attending are regularly between 40-50.

Health and Hope UK for Myanmar

We have organised events to raise funds for this charity which seeks to bring hope, relief from poverty and development opportunities to rural communities in Myanmar (formerly Burma).

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

All of the charity income is from voluntary donations.

Investment policy and objectives

All excess income is held in UK banking accounts and is therefore subject to, and protected by, the UK banking regulations.

Financial position

There is a surplus of income over expenditure for the year of £2,401 (2023 deficit £9,788).

Reserves policy

To maintain sufficient funds to ensure the ongoing work of the charity and the causes that fit within our objectives.

The trustees ensure that the reserves held are in excess of three months of standard expenditure. The reserves held are calculated as three months fixed running costs which include salary, PAYE, and pension contributions.

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

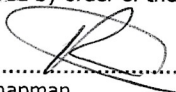
- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently.

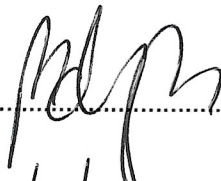

1 GENERAL INFORMATION

The charity is limited by guarantee, incorporated in England, and consequently has no share capital. In the event of the Charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the Charity. Including any member of the CIO within 12 months before the commencement of the winding up. The Charity is registered in England and Wales (charity no. 1194261).

2 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The Accounts have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102).

The Charity is small and has taken advantage of the exemption provided by Section 7 of FRS 102 and has not prepared a Cash Flow Statement.

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Pound Sterling.

The charity meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102.

INCOMING RESOURCES

Recognition of incoming resources

Incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when:

- the charity becomes entitled to the resources and any conditions for receipt are met;
- the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources; and
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

EXPENDITURE AND LIABILITIES

Liabilities are recognised and expended as soon as there is a legal and constructive obligation committing the Charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is included on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to that category.

Governance costs comprise all costs involving the public accountability of the Charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice. These costs include costs related to accountancy services.

TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

All assets costing more than £250 are capitalised.

Tangible assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets over their estimated useful life:

Furniture and equipment - 25% Reducing balance

Computer equipment - 3 Years straight line

TAXATION

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

CASH AT BANK AND IN HAND

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash in hand, deposits with banks and funds that are readily convertible into cash at, or close to, their carrying values, but are not held for investment purposes.

CREDITORS AND ACCRUALS

Creditors are recognised where the Charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in a transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due can be measured or estimated reliably.

FUNDS

Unrestricted funds comprise those funds which the Trustees are free to use for any purpose in furtherance of the charitable objects.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
