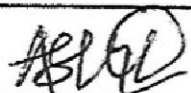

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF
EMMANUEL KOINONIA CHURCH

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December, 2022

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The Charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The Charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 and that an independent examination is needed.

Basis of independent examiner's report
