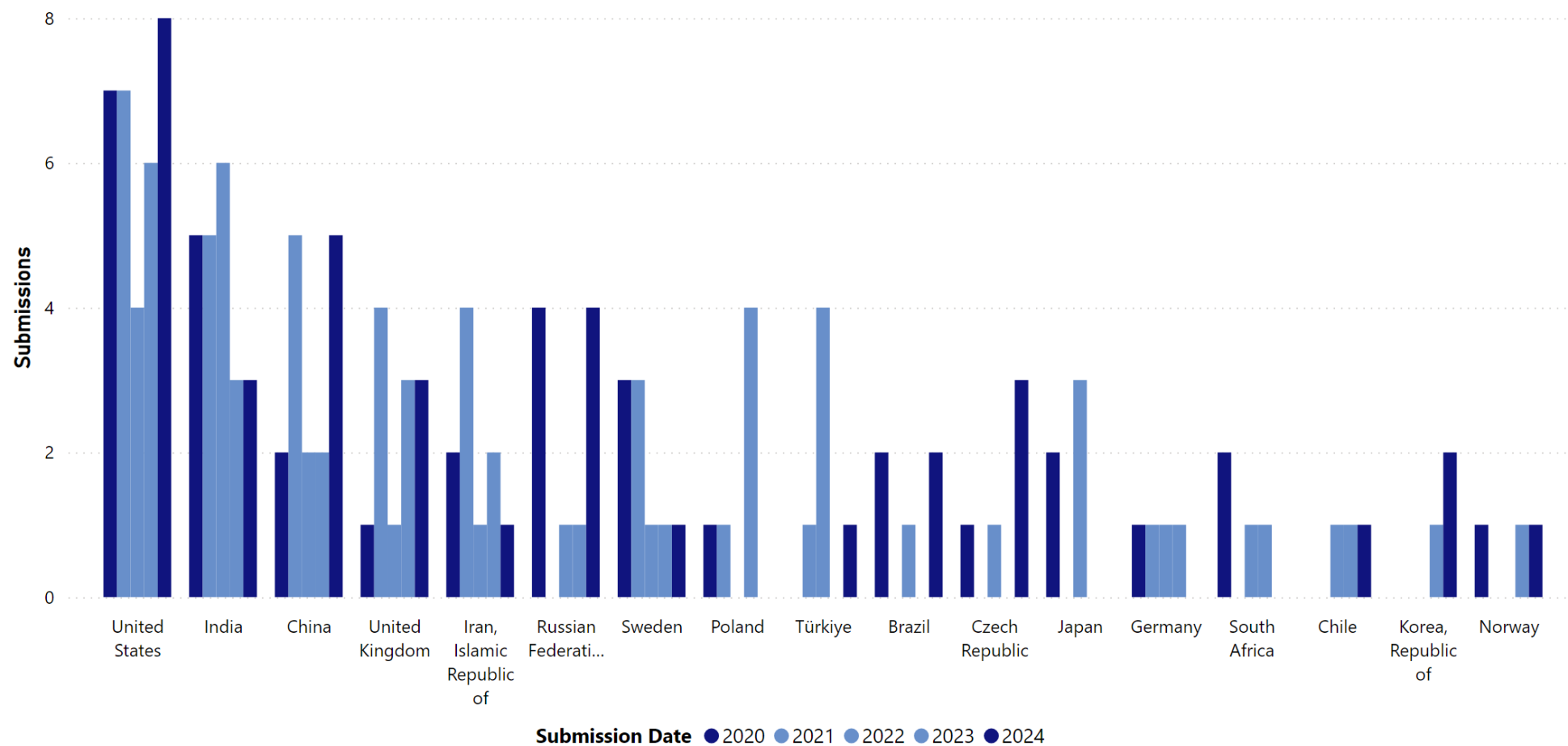

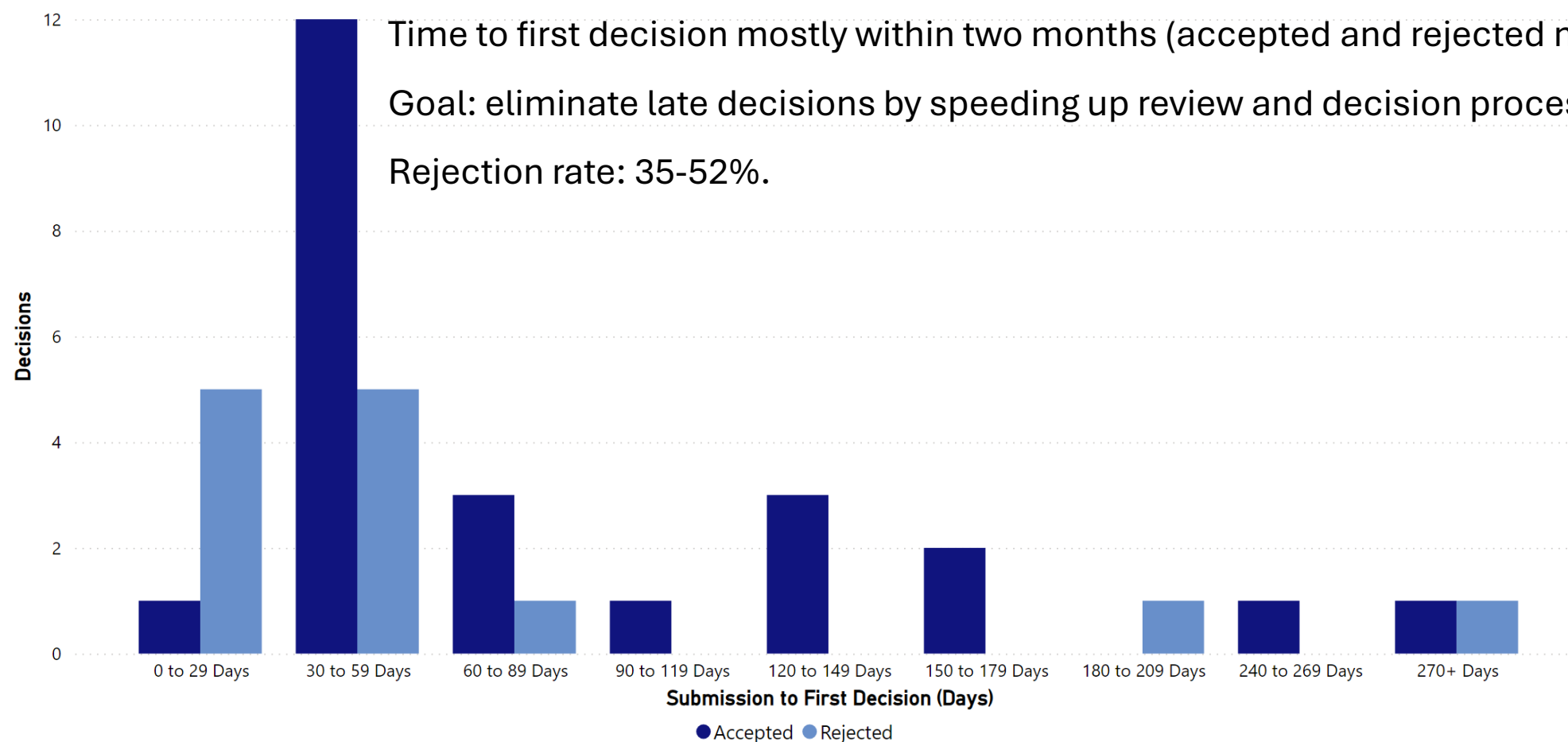

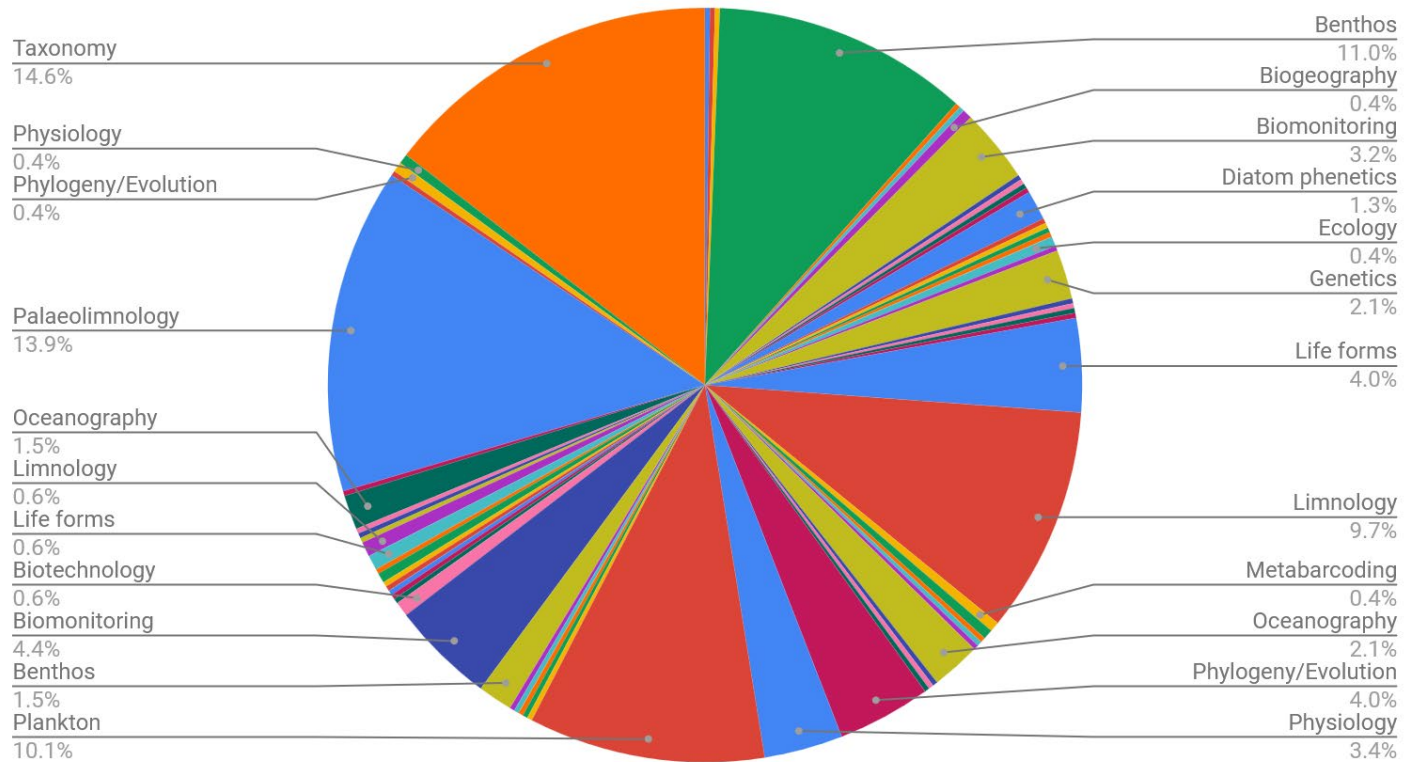


Count of Continent

SEX AND THE DIATOM

Sexual reproduction was discovered in diatoms in 1847 and the essential features of the life cycle (size reduction reversed by expansion of a special cell, the auxospore) were established about 20 years later. However, few people ever see auxosporulation and the complete life cycle is known for very few species. I will explore why this is and whether it matters.

Proposed joint meeting 2029

International Society for Diatom Research / Molecular Life of Diatoms group

Matt Julius offered organising the meeting in Minneapolis, USA; anticipated size ca. 400 participants

Discussion, AGM 2025: of 25 members participating: 23 supportive, 1 abstained, 1 opposed.

Pros / solutions

2 separate meetings that overlap.

1 meeting with joint morning sessions, parallel afternoon sessions.

Joint sessions only to introduce all aspects of diatom research to all attendees, no parallel sessions as these would divide audiences along traditional lines.

Rigorous selection of talks, majority of talks by ECRs.

High interest in molecular studies; range of molecular topics could be expanded by including more presentations on phylogeny / diatom evolution.

New collaborations, more combination of morphological and molecular methods; special event to meet potential collaborators.

Molecular studies might benefit from support by taxonomists to improve taxon identification.

Information on the function of morphological structures / their relevance for identification.

Potential to attract additional sponsorship.

Generation of profit to invest in special event for ECRs.

Joint meeting every 4 years.

Cons

High registration costs, need for professional conference organiser.

Meeting size, limited opportunities to interact.

MLD attendees might outnumber ISDR members.

Too many submissions, limited time and reduced opportunity to present on traditional topics of interest to ISDR members.

Limited relevance to research by ISDR members, one or few topics might dominate; MLD 2025: most talks were on cell biology and physiology, few talks on phylogeny or molecular interaction between species.

MDL uses diatoms as proxies, rather than study of diatoms as organisms.

Unlikely to recruit new members from the MLD group due to different focus of ISDR research.

Contributes to the decline of organism based societies, meetings and science.

Meeting in the USA: problems obtaining US visas – high costs, logistical problems organising travel (long waiting times for visa decisions, e.g. for students 1 month before meeting); colleagues from certain countries might be excluded because they might not be given visas.

Future meetings - general comments

Separate joint meeting ISDR/MLD with focus on molecular studies only, but not as a substitute to IDS.

Poster sessions with short (2-3 minutes) PowerPoint presentations.

Balasubramanian Karthick: proposal IDS 2029 in India.

Time: late August/early September 2029

Venue: resort near Puna
