Trustees' Report for the period to 24 March 2025

Aims and Objectives

1. Our constitution states that our object as a charity is

“To advance the participation, education and appreciation of the general public of all ages in the art and science of brass band music in Cheltenham, wider Gloucestershire and the South West through the provision of rehearsal facilities, instrument loan and tuition and by participation in concerts and contests.”

2. The main activities we undertake are as set down in this statement. The Trustees have considered the Charity Commission’s guidance on public benefit and are satisfied that the Charity’s aims and activities meet the criteria set.

Achievements and Performance

1. In our view, the band has met all objectives and in many respects we have achieved performance well in excess of those objectives.
2. Our view is evidenced by:
 - a. Many concerts during the reporting year, both the Silver Band, Training Band and joint bands, with a total audience estimated to be in excess of several thousand.
 - b. Two bands from CSB attended the West of England Regional Contest in March, and the Silver Band attended the local Wychavon Festival of Brass Contest in October.
 - c. The Silver Band rehearses twice a week throughout the year.
 - d. We confirmed our commitment to providing learner tuition, both in groups and as individuals, through the establishment of a weekly Learner Band rehearsal on Monday evening, routinely attended by a dozen or more members.
 - e. People of all ages joining the band to learn to play; we have new members still at Primary school and others who are of retirement age.
 - f. Training band rehearse each Friday evening where possible, often with up to 30 players in a rehearsal.

Structure, Governance and Management

1. Cheltenham Silver Band adopted a constitution that meets all the guidelines given by the Charities Commission when it registered as a Charitable incorporated organisation (CIO) on 3rd June 2021.
2. Trustees are appointed for a term of 3 year by a resolution passed at a properly convened meeting of the charity trustees.
3. In addition, we appoint a Musical Director for each Band, who is responsible for conducting rehearsals, the selection of music and the band's concert and contest performances.
4. Cheltenham Silver Band is chaired by one management committee, made up of Silver Band and Training Band members. The committee is responsible for the day to day running of all activities.

Reference and Administrative details

1. The name of the Charity is registered as **Cheltenham Silver Band** Charity number: 1194662
2. The charity also performs using the name **Cheltenham Silver Training Band**, **Cheltenham Silver Learner Band**, and **Cheltenham Academy Band** when this group of players is hired as an entity or performing as an entity, although all players are members of Cheltenham Silver Band.

Financial Report

1. Income and Expenditure by category are summarised in the Accounts for the Year to 24 March 2025 on pages 4 & 5.
2. A ring-fenced grant of £50,000 from the Charles Irving Trust was received by Cheltenham Silver Band, Charity No 1163618, during the financial year ending 24 March 2020 to fund a long-term rehearsal venue for the band. This was transferred to Cheltenham Silver Band, Charity Number 1194662 during the financial year ended 24 March 2024. As of yet our search for a venue has not been fruitful and the complete £50,000 remains ring-fenced.
3. A further grant of £4,000 was received by Cheltenham Silver Band, Charity No 1163618, in the period ending 24 March 2019 from the Charles Irving Trust in support of the annual Musical Showcase – now renamed “The Sir Charles Irving Musical Showcase”. The remaining funds were transferred to Cheltenham Silver Band, Charity Number 1194662 during the financial year ended 24 March 2024. These funds are ring-fenced for the sole purpose of running the Showcase, including awards, room hire, refreshments and any other expenses solely attributable to the Showcase. We expect this grant to be sufficient to run the Showcase for 10 years or more. We did not incur any expenses for a showcase this year.
4. Our financial position has remained reasonably static and our reserves remain sufficient for most contingencies. Our aim is to retain sufficient for one year’s running costs plus the expected annual deficit of £1,000 to £2,000 relating to increased rehearsal space hire until we move into new long-term accommodation. Within the running costs reserve there is contingency for the hire of suitable storage for the band’s assets should the band cease to operate, until the trustees reform the band or decide to dissolve the band and sell or distribute the assets for the benefit of the Cheltenham community. A small profit has occurred for the year end 24th March 2025, this however will be offset by a large uniform expense early in the following year, we therefore expect a larger than usual deficit for the year end 24th March 2026.

1. Statement of Assets and Liabilities

This statement identifies all the assets and liabilities of the Charity as at 24 March 2025.

2. Grant from Charles Irving Trust

A grant of £50,000 was received by Cheltenham Silver Band, Charity No 1163618, during the financial year ending 24 March 2020 from the Charles Irving Trust to assist with costs of future long-term accommodation. This was transferred to Cheltenham Silver Band, Charity Number 1194662 during the financial year ended 24 March 2024. The full amount will be spent on expenses in association with long-term accommodation.

3. Grant from Charles Irving Trust

A grant of £4,000 was received in April 2018 by Cheltenham Silver Band, Charity No 1163618, during the financial year ended 24 March 2019 from the Charles Irving Trust to fund an annual Musical Showcase for all the trainees in the band. The remaining funds were transferred to Cheltenham Silver Band, Charity Number 1194662 during the financial year ended 24 March 2024. The grant is treated as restricted as it can only be used for expenditure specifically identified as room hire, refreshments, medals and certificates associated with the Showcase.

4. Trustees' Remuneration and Expenses

No remuneration directly or indirectly out of the funds of the Charity was paid or payable for the period to any Trustee.

No reimbursement of personal expenses has been made or is due to be made to any of the Trustees in respect of the period (2023/24 £ nil).

5. Transfer of Cash assets from Cheltenham Silver Band, Charity Number 1163618

During the year ended 24 March 2024, the cash assets of Cheltenham Silver Band, Charity Number 1163618 were transferred to this charity.

6. Assets retained for the Charity's own use

Assets retained for the charity's own use are the instruments, music and uniforms owned by the band. Replacement costs are identified in our insurance policy as £94,000, which is the estimated cost of replacement, although sale costs would be lower as the music and uniforms have a negligible resale value. Consequently no value is placed on these assets in the Statement of Assets and Liabilities. A full list of band owned instruments is set out below. All assets are securely stored when not in use.
