REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

for the Year Ended 31 March 2025

The Trustees present their report with the financial statements of the Together for Mission (the "Charity") for the year from 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

CONSTITUTION

The Charity was established as a charity by a partnership of local churches including Enfield Town Community Church (ETCC), Bush Hill Park Community Church, Causeway Free Church, Silver Street Community Church and Bury Street Community Church, and was subsequently joined by High Barnet Baptist Church. It was registered with the Charity Commission in June 2021.

The Charity is governed by a constitution established in 2021.

APPOINTMENT OF OFFICIALS

The Trustees of the Charity include representatives from the Partnership Churches including some of the Pastors and one external trustee.

The Trustees are responsible for the induction of any new colleague which involves an awareness of the responsibilities of the position, the governing document, and the Charity's policy and procedures.

MISSION

The mission of the Charity is the advancement of the Christian faith in accordance with the Basis of Faith primarily but not exclusively within the London Borough of Enfield and the surrounding neighbourhood; and such other charitable purposes as shall, in the opinion of the Trustees of the Charity, put into practice the Christian faith in accordance with the Basis of Faith, including but not limited to: the prevention and relief of need, hardship and sickness and the advancement of education. The Charity supports the provision of facilities for the local community.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The Charity manages the activities of a partnership of local Churches in the Enfield area. This includes joint events, youth activities and outreach work.

The Charity is also in new church development.

REVIEW OF THE YEAR

The Charity organised events for its partner community Churches including Men's and Women's Days, youth activities including a residential camp in the summer and a Festival Day.

During the year the Charity raised funds to support a Youth Pastor at High Barnet Baptist Church. James Critpoh was appointed Assistant Pastor in September 2025.

The Charity is also undertaking the development of a new Church in the Turkey Street area. The Charity has leased a building in Elsinge Road for an initial term of three years which commenced in August 2024.

With support and funding from partner churches and other donors the Charity has started a new Church meeting in the leased building. The first meeting was in August 2023 and there are now around 40 people meeting regularly. The Church at Turkey Street is led by Gareth Skyrme, an experienced Church planter.

The Charity has an option to acquire the freehold of the land and building at Elsinge Road at any time up until August 2027. The option price to purchase the site is £1,050,000. Development of the site would require further funding. After the year end the Charity undertook an options study for the future development of the site which may involve opportunities to recover some of the development costs.

The Charity does not currently have sufficient resources to meet the option cost and the future development of the site. In July 2025 the Charity launched a fundraising campaign to raise the funds required to exercise the option and develop the site.

The fundraising target represents a significant sum, but the Trustees are confident that the funding can be raised.

FUTURE ACTIVITIES

The Charity's future activities include;

- Continue working with the partnership churches
- Continue to establish the new church in Turkey Street
- Raise the funds for the purchase and development of the site at Elsinge Road.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Details of related party transactions are included in note 10.

FINANCIAL POSITION

The Charity's work with the partner churches is included in the unrestricted funds which generated a surplus in the year of £32,645 (2024 surplus - £27,824).

The restricted funds are primarily for the development of the Turkey Street Church.

The Charity received £51,101 for Turkey Street Community Church. Total expenditure on weekly meetings and church activities was £85,563, giving a deficit of £35,049. The trustees expect that this deficit will reduce as the church grows.

In addition, the Charity received £21,422 of donations towards the development of the building at Elsinge Road for use by the Turkey Street Community Church. A total of £4,579 was spent on items preparing the church for meetings and activities. The balance of £16,742 has been used to pay for the development of the building for Turkey Street Community Church.

A further amount of £16,265 (2024 - £nil) was received in donations towards the funding for the Assistant Pastor at High Barnet Baptist Church. This has been carried forward within restricted funds.

RESERVES POLICY

The objective is that the reserves of the Charity will be sufficient to fund the activities for twelve months. The charity is currently assessing the cost of the planned Church development in Turkey Street in Enfield but estimates that it has sufficient funds to continue to operate for at least the twelve months.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustees have conducted a review of the major risks to which the Charity would be exposed, and systems are being implemented to mitigate those risks where possible. The risks and systems will be regularly reviewed.

VOLUNTEERS

The Charity's activities are supported by volunteers from the partner Churches.

TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

Charity law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and of its financial activities for that period. In preparing those financial statements the Trustees are required to:

- (a) select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- (b) make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- (c) state whether the policies adopted are in accordance with SORP 2005 and with applicable accounting standards, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- (d) prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the Charity will continue.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the Charity and to enable them to ascertain that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 1993. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud or other irregularities.

REPORT OF THE INDEPENDENT EXAMINER TO THE TRUSTEES OF

I report on the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31 March 2025, which are set out on pages 7 to 16.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements and assessment of going concern

The financial statements of the Charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice' applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective October 2019) and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The Trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

Incoming resources

Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when it is receivable.

No value of services by volunteers has been included in these accounts.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category

Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes; cash, bank current accounts and bank deposit accounts with no withdrawal limitations.

Creditors

Creditors are recognised where the Charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors are recognised at their settlement amount.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Tangible fixed assets

Fixed assets for use by the Church with a value of greater than £1,500 are capitalised at cost and depreciated.

Property work in progress costs and leasehold improvements in respect of the Turkey Street Community Church will be depreciated once the option to acquire the site has been determined.

Fixtures and equipment is depreciated over three years.

Taxation

The Charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Restricted funds

The Charity has restricted funds which represent donations and other income for the establishment and operation of a new Church in the Turkey Street area of Enfield and another to provide funding for an Assistant Pastor at High Barnet Church.

Unrestricted funds

The general funds are donations and other income received or generated for the mission of the Charity without further specific purpose.

The Fixed Asset Fund represents the net book value of the charities fixed assets.

Financial instruments

The Charity has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are valued at their settlement value.

The charity is currently assessing the cost of the planned Church development in Turkey Street in Enfield but estimates that it has sufficient funds to develop the new premises and operate for the next year.
