REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

for the Period Ended 31 March 2022

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for period since incorporation on 16 June 2021 to 31 March 2022. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

CONSTITUTION

Together for Mission (the Charity) was established as a charity by a partnership of local churches including Enfield Town Community Church (ETCC), Bush Hill Park Community Church, Causeway Free Church, Silver Street Community Church and Bury Street Community Church. It was registered with the Charity Commission in June 2021.

The Charity is governed by a constitution established in 2021.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The principal activity of the Charity was the advancement of the Christian faith in accordance with the Basis of Faith primarily but not exclusively within the London Borough of Enfield and the surrounding neighbourhood; and such other charitable purposes as shall, in the opinion of the Trustee of the Charity, put into practice the Christian faith in accordance with the Basis of Faith, including but not limited to: the prevention and relief of need, hardship and sickness and the advancement of education". The Charity supports the provision of facilities for the local community.

APPOINTMENT OF OFFICIALS

The trustees of the Charity are the Pastors of the Partnership Churches.

The trustees are responsible for the induction of any new colleague which involves an awareness of the responsibilities of the position, the governing document, and the Charity's policy and procedures.

They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud or other irregularities.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements and assessment of going concern

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective October 2019)', the Charities Act 2011 and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the Charity's ability to continue as a going concern.

Incoming resources

Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when it is receivable. Legacies and donations are included in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are received.

No value of services by volunteers has been included in these accounts.

Expenditure

No expenditure has been incurred in the period.

Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and in hand includes; cash, bank current accounts and bank deposit accounts with no withdrawal limitations. The Charity had no cash balances at any stage in the period.

Creditors

Creditors are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors are recognised at their settlement amount.
