Despite schools in Akurala being free to attend, many children face significant barriers to education. Local families often struggle to afford essential school supplies, such as stationery, uniforms, shoes, and bags. Without these basic necessities, children are often unable to attend school. Sri Lanka's ongoing economic challenges have only worsened this issue, making education even less accessible for many. So this year, KFA also fundraised to provide school supplies for children in Akurala and its surrounding areas, and managed to provide supplies for over 800 children. These supplies are essential to ensuring these children can attend school and access the opportunities that education brings.

The new premises has running water, toilets, electricity, two large classroom areas and space to run around and play - all of which they did not have in their old building. KFA hopes that this new pre-school can provide an early introduction to spoken English, maximising the children of Akurala's opportunities at preparatory school and beyond.
