
Basis of independent examiner's report

We continue to raise awareness of the challenges faced by low-income families living in the Highway 192 area of Central Florida by speaking at churches across the UK. Through these efforts, we are strengthening our commitment to supporting this community.

From the end of January to the end of March 2025, one of our Trustees spent two months in the Highway 192 area, working directly with families and individuals living in motels. This hands-on engagement was a vital part of our recent outreach, which has been highly successful. Through partnership with Beyond Pregnancy Care in Kissimmee, we are mentoring new and expectant fathers, equipping them with support and guidance through trained volunteers. Additionally, our collaboration with The Altar Community Church in St Cloud and A Place for Grace Ministries has enabled us to provide essential assistance to individuals struggling with homelessness and poverty.

Together, through strong partnerships and community action, we remain dedicated to making a meaningful impact in Kissimmee and St Cloud.





Our partnership relationship with Beyond Pregnancy Care in Kissimmee is strong with regular team meetings over Zoom. We have been able to offer training to the staff and volunteers at Beyond and have been supporting dads online through mentoring and courses.

We are continuing to develop links with other community organisations in Central Florida such as Kissimmee First Church of the Nazarene (which is across the street from Beyond Pregnancy Care Centre). As we continue to work together, we will be able to offer more parenting, practical and pastoral support to local families with many of them living in motels along Highway 192. We are committed to reaching these hidden families with the Father's love.

- 3) Reviving Faith (Pastoral Support)



Our partnership relationship with Beyond Pregnancy Care in Kissimmee is strong with regular team meetings over Zoom. We have been able to offer training to the staff and volunteers at Beyond and have been supporting dads online through mentoring and courses.

We aim to build on these connections with a visit to Florida planned later in the year to help with outreach work to families in the local community around Highway 192. Also, we will be visiting more churches in the UK to share about the charity's mission and invite others to partner with us in the work.

We are also developing links with other community organisations in Central Florida such as Kissimmee First Church of the Nazarene (which is across the street from Beyond Pregnancy Care Centre). As we continue to work together, we will be able to offer more parenting, practical and pastoral support to local families with many of them living in motels along Highway 192. We are committed to reaching these hidden families with the Father's love.
