TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2025

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 July 2025.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the Charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (effective 1 January 2019).

Objectives and activities

To enhance the lives of children who have been affected by physical, emotional, or psychological abuse. Through fund raising and events, the foundation supports the charities and organisations that helps to shape, and continue to support Tony Hudgell's new life. We aim to highlight causes and share donations raised for selected charities and individuals to help children have a better tomorrow.

Public benefit

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the Charity should undertake.

Achievements and performance

There was a decline in fund raising activities during 2024/25 with founders Mark Hudgell being diagnosed with prostate cancer in July 2024 and Paula Hudgell's cancer returning with some aggression in June 2025. With positive attitude that we would overcome this dreadful disease our efforts were concentrated on planning a trip for 61 children with backgrounds of abuse / 100 people in total to Lapland in December 2025. Thanks to the successful fund raising efforts the previous year we paid the £20k deposit to Canterbury Travel.

In this current financial year we made a £30k donation to The Sheffield Children's Hospital – one of only 3 dedicated children's hospital trusts in the UK that provides healthcare to children from all over the country. We made further donations of sensory equipment to the Evelina Children's Hospital and provided funding for therapy and counselling for a number of children who had suffered from abuse. We continued to raise funds specifically for our Christmas Present Appeal and again provided hundreds of presents for children who would receive little or nothing at Christmas. Additionally, we were able to support the Church, specialist schools and individual referrals during this period.

Financial review

Year four of the Foundation saw a decline in donations, partly due to the extraordinary amount raised in the previous period and partly due to both founders being diagnosed with cancer. We still raised over £19k, and donations out were £57k. This figure included the £20k deposit for the Lapland trip with an expected additional £100k to pay.

The Christmas Present Appeal raised £5,763 and we spent £4,053 on presents, with the excess being ringfenced for birthday presents during the year for children who would receive nothing.

We aim to make every penny raised work for the children who need it and we keep overheads to a minimum. We take no salary and have not claimed any expenses.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the Charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the Charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

1 Accounting policies

Charity information

Tony Hudgell Foundation is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation. The registered address is 17 Victoria Drive, Kings Hill, West Malling, Kent ME19 4DT.

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011, FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Charities SORP "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)". The Charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The Charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities not to prepare a statement of cash flows.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the Charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £1.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors or grantors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds are subject to specific conditions by donors that the capital must be maintained by the Charity.

1.4 Income

Income is recognised when the Charity is legally entitled to it after any performance conditions have been met, the amounts can be measured reliably, and it is probable that income will be received.

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. Other donations are recognised once the Charity has been notified of the donation, unless performance conditions require deferral of the amount. Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

1 Accounting policies (Continued)

1.5 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement, and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure is classified by activity. The costs of each activity are made up of the total of direct costs and shared costs, including support costs involved in undertaking each activity. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs which contribute to more than one activity and support costs which are not attributable to a single activity are apportioned between those activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Central staff costs are allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges are allocated on the portion of the asset's use.

1.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.

We aim to highlight causes and share donations raised for selected charities and individuals to help children have a better tomorrow.

Public benefit

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the Charity should undertake.

Achievements and performance

2023/24 saw two extremely successful fund raising events. The first of which was Tony's climb of Orrest Head in the Lake District where he was joined by Sir Chris Bonington and former Gurkha, Hari Budha Magar. The event raised over £55k which was shared across 4 charities, Tony Hudgell Foundation, Crohn's & Colitis UK, The Bendrigg Trust and The Lake District Foundation. The second was a remarkable 2400km walk from Manchester to Ibiza by 22 year old Henry Moore who raised over £167k for the Foundation. Tony flew out to Ibiza to walk the final leg with Henry to a huge reception from well wishers and supporters.

In this current financial year we have continued our charitable efforts by making further donations to the Evelina Children's Hospital. We funded a course of Physiotherapy sessions, purchased a purpose built wheelchair for a child who was abused as a baby and supported therapy sessions for both children and their parents. We continued to raise funds specifically for our Christmas Present Appeal and again provided hundreds of presents for children who would receive little or nothing at Christmas. Additionally we were able to support the Church, specialist schools and individual referrals during this period.

Financial review

In its third year the Foundation received a substantial increase in its income, totalling £260,841 largely due to the success of the two main fund raising events. Because Henry's Walk took place close to our financial year-end a significant portion of these funds remained in the Foundations bank account. In consultation with Henry we are now planning a very special trip for children who have experienced abuse along with their adoptive parents and siblings. We aim to take 50 participants from Manchester and 50 from Gatwick on a four-night trip to Lapland in December 2025. These families have provided a safe and secure environment for the children but get limited support from authorities. Having read every application for a place on the trip we are deeply moved by the challenges these children and their families have faced and we are committed to giving them a magical and restorative experience.



Charity information

Tony Hudgell Foundation is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation. The registered address is 17 Victoria Drive , Kings Hill, West Malling, Kent ME19 4DT.

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 July 2024.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the Charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (effective 1 January 2019).

Objectives and activities

To enhance the lives of children who have been affected by physical, emotional, or psychological abuse. Through fund raising and events, the foundation supports the charities and organisations that helps to shape, and continue to support Tony Hudgell's new life. We aim to highlight causes and share donations raised for selected charities and individuals to help children have a better tomorrow.

Public benefit

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the Charity should undertake.

Achievements and performance

2023/24 saw two extremely successful fund raising events. The first of which was Tony's climb of Orrest Head in the Lake District where he was joined by Sir Chris Bonington and former Gurkha, Hari Budha Magar. The event raised over £55k which was shared across 4 charities, Tony Hudgell Foundation, Crohn's & Colitis UK, The Bendrigg Trust and The Lake District Foundation. The second was a remarkable 2400km walk from Manchester to Ibiza by 22 year old Henry Moore who raised over £167k for the Foundation. Tony flew out to Ibiza to walk the final leg with Henry to a huge reception from well wishers and supporters.

In this current financial year we have continued our charitable efforts by making further donations to the Evelina Children's Hospital. We funded a course of Physiotherapy sessions, purchased a purpose built wheelchair for a child who was abused as a baby and supported therapy sessions for both children and their parents. We continued to raise funds specifically for our Christmas Present Appeal and again provided hundreds of presents for children who would receive little or nothing at Christmas. Additionally we were able to support the Church, specialist schools and individual referrals during this period.

Financial review

In its third year the Foundation received a substantial increase in its income, totalling £260,841 largely due to the success of the two main fund raising events. Because Henry's Walk took place close to our financial year-end a significant portion of these funds remained in the Foundations bank account. In consultation with Henry we are now planning a very special trip for children who have experienced abuse along with their adoptive parents and siblings. We aim to take 50 participants from Manchester and 50 from Gatwick on a four-night trip to Lapland in December 2025. These families have provided a safe and secure environment for the children but get limited support from authorities. Having read every application for a place on the trip we are deeply moved by the challenges these children and their families have faced and we are committed to giving them a magical and restorative experience.

Reserves policy

This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.



TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2023

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 31 July 2023.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the financial statements and comply with the Charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (effective 1 January 2019).

Objectives and activities

To enhance the lives of children who have been affected by physical, emotional, or psychological abuse. Through fund raising and events, the foundation supports the charities and organisations that helps to shape, and continue to support Tony Hudgell's new life. We aim to highlight causes and share donations raised for selected charities and individuals to help children have a better tomorrow.

Public benefit

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the Charity should undertake.

Achievements and performance

2022/23 has been a challenging year for the Foundation with Founder, trustee and Tonys mum, Paula being diagnosed with Bowel Cancer and undergoing major surgery. We had to postpone a big fund-raising event in the Lake District which had been in the planning for a long time.

We continued to raise awareness of the Tony Hudgell Foundation through social media and raise funds enabling us to support some very worthy causes. These included a purpose-built wheelchair for a little girl who had suffered emotional abuse and a weekend in Centre Parcs for a family of children who were adopted but with a back story which is totally shocking.

Yet again our Christmas Present Appeal was a huge success both in terms of receiving donations and in providing hundreds of presents for children who would receive little or nothing at Christmas. We were again able to support the Church and food banks through the festive period.

So, after a difficult year we have come out the other side ready to build on what we have achieved so far.

Financial review

Year two of the Foundation has seen a reduction in donation income due to the reasons mentioned above. From the 24.6k raised, 4.8k was specifically for the present appeal and those funds remain ringfenced for the purchase of gifts for children who needs a little something at Christmas and throughout the year. Donations for causes supported by our core objectives totalled £19,319.

There are no salaried positions within the Foundation and expenses and kept to a bare minimum. The travel expenditure of £565 was predominantly travel between Kent and The Lake District in preparation for fund raising event which will benefit the 2023/24 accounts.

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the Charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees consider that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the Charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

Structure, governance and management

The Charity is a charitable incorporated organisation, registered with the Charity Commission and is constituted by its governing document.

1 Accounting policies

Charity information

Tony Hudgell Foundation is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation. The registered address is Hudson House, 8 Tavistock Street, London WC2E 7PP.

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charity's [governing document], the Charities Act 2011, FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" ("FRS 102") and the Charities SORP "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (effective 1 January 2019). The Charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The Charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the Charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £1.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the Charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors or grantors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Endowment funds are subject to specific conditions by donors that the capital must be maintained by the Charity.

1.4 Income

Income is recognised when the Charity is legally entitled to it after any performance conditions have been met, the amounts can be measured reliably, and it is probable that income will be received.

Cash donations are recognised on receipt. Other donations are recognised once the Charity has been notified of the donation, unless performance conditions require deferral of the amount. Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

1.5 Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement, and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

Expenditure is classified by activity. The costs of each activity are made up of the total of direct costs and shared costs, including support costs involved in undertaking each activity. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs which contribute to more than one activity and support costs which are not attributable to a single activity are apportioned between those activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Central staff costs are allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges are allocated on the portion of the asset's use.

1.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash in hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities.
