The principle sources of income from the Charities activities are generated by donations & grants. During the year income from grants amounted to £29,704 and income from charitable activities amounted to £65,384.

Total expenditure for the year was £110,517 resulting in an overall deficit of £15,429. At 31 March 2022 the charity held reserves of £38,966.

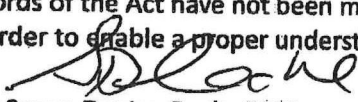
