hall for conducting our service. We also conducted meetings through zoom due to lack of suitable hall. We believe that our service has produced good results in reaching and helping members of the community.

The charity's main costs are travel, charitable activities, and subsidies for pastoral activities. The charity income is highly affected due to lack of gathering place. We are trying to find a meeting hall as soon as possible.

Our income form donation, which was our main source of income, has been affected highly due to lack of permanent worship place. We are trying to find suitable place for our services.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting
