# **TRUSTEE ANNUAL REPORT**

## **FOR THE YEAR 1 APRIL 2024 – 31 MARCH 2025**

### **1. Introduction**

The Trustees of Makaado Charity Organisation (“MCO”) are pleased to present their Annual Report together with the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2025.

MCO remains committed to supporting vulnerable communities suffering from poverty, displacement and hardship, particularly in East Africa and among refugee families, as well as supporting those in need in the UK.

During the reporting period, we continued to expand our humanitarian support, focusing on food distribution, orphan support and poverty relief. Our Ramadan Iftar campaign and Udhiya (Qurbani) programme were key delivery objectives for this year.

### **2. Governance and Legal Structure**

Makaado Charity Organisation is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) registered with the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

**3. Charity Objectives**

The charity's purposes as stated in its constitution are:

**(a) Relief of Poverty**

To prevent or relieve poverty and financial hardship—particularly but not limited to the neighbouring countries of Eritrea—and throughout England and Wales, by providing grants, services and essential support to vulnerable households, refugees and displaced individuals.

**(b) Improving Quality of Life**

To provide recreational and educational support to improve living conditions for individuals affected by youth disadvantage, disability, financial hardship, age or social circumstances.

## **4. Activities and Achievements 2024–2025**

### **4.1 Key Activities Delivered**

#### **Ramadan Iftar Campaign**

Two Iftar campaigns were delivered during the financial year (March 2024 and March 2025) providing food parcels to low-income families in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

#### **Udhiya (Qurbani) Programme – June 2024**

MCO organised and funded Udhiya meat distribution, providing fresh meat to households that would not otherwise access it.

#### **Formal Partnership Agreement**

MCO signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Afar Light Bringers, a registered civil society organisation in the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia, on 9 February 2024. This agreement strengthens compliance, delivery capacity, and due-diligence mechanisms for international aid distribution.

#### **5. Public Benefit Statement**

The trustees confirm that they have complied with their duty under section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the Charity Commission’s guidance on public benefit. All charitable activities undertaken during the year directly further MCO’s aims and provide measurable public benefit.

- Verified distribution and monitoring mechanisms are in place to confirm appropriate use of funds



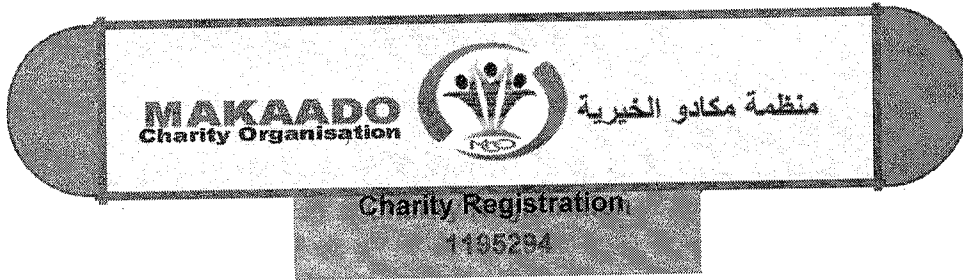

### Introduction

Established on July 26, 2021, as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), our organisation is committed to alleviating hunger and poverty both locally and globally. Our mission is to empower individuals by promoting sustainable income generation and providing the skills needed to achieve self-sufficiency.

In this year's trustees' report, we are pleased to announce the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding with a charity registered under the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia's Authority for Civil Society Organisations on February 9, 2024.

Additionally, we launched a fundraising campaign for Iftar during the month of Ramadan in 2024, which commenced on March 20th. The campaign was successfully concluded, with funds collected and distributed to those in need in Addis Ababa. The details of this initiative will be included in our financial report for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2025.

### Objects of the Charity:

- a The prevention or relief of poverty or financial hardships specifically but not limited to the neighbouring countries of Eritrea and throughout England and Wales by providing grants, items and services to individuals in need and /or other charities and organisations, sponsoring of orphans and assisting in the provision of education, training, healthcare projects and all the necessary support designed to enable the poor, needy and refugee communities and individuals to subsist and generate a sustainable income to become self-sufficient.
- b The provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life of those persons who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship, or social and economic circumstances.

### Statement of Trustees Responsibilities



### Introduction

Established on July 26, 2021, as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), our organization's mission is to alleviate hunger and poverty both domestically and internationally. We strive to empower individuals through sustainable income generation, equipping them with the skills and resources to achieve self-sufficiency.

However, our initial efforts were hampered by the lack of a partner charity within our target operational area, making project development and fundraising challenging.

Furthermore, the risky nature of some target regions presented additional difficulties in establishing the projects, so as to raise funds due to the absence of established channels and legally registered charities.

Even though these challenges been there initially, we are now pleased to announce a potential partnership with a local charity. This collaboration holds significant promise to facilitate the commencement of our charitable activities in the designated areas. While their official status is under verification, we have requested legal documentation to ensure proper due diligence before finalizing a Memorandum of Understanding.

### Objectives of the Charity:

- a The prevention or relief of poverty or financial hardships specifically but not limited to the neighbouring countries of Eritrea and throughout England and Wales by providing grants, items and services to individuals in need and /or other charities and organisations, sponsoring of orphans and assisting in the provision of education, training, healthcare projects and all the necessary support designed to enable the poor, needy and refugee communities and individuals to subsist and generate a sustainable income to become self-sufficient.
- b The provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life of those persons who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship, or social and economic circumstances.

## TRUSTEE REPORT FOR THE PERIOD

FROM 26/07/2021 TO 31/03/2022

### Introduction

The charity was incorporated as CIO on 26th July 2021, with the intention to feed the hungry and help the poor both at home and in the region of East Africa; and to teach them techniques and equip them to generate a sustainable income to become self-sufficient as our objective's states. However, Due to delays in establishing bank account, there has been no financial or other operational activity undertaken by the CIO in this period.

### Objects of the Charity:

- a The prevention or relief of poverty or financial hardships specifically but not limited to the neighbouring countries of Eritrea and throughout England and Wales by providing grants, items and services to individuals in need and /or other charities and organisations, sponsoring of orphans and assisting in the provision of education, training, healthcare projects and all the necessary support designed to enable the poor, needy and refugee communities and individuals to subsist and generate a sustainable income to become self-sufficient.
- b The provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life of those persons who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship, or social and economic circumstances.

### Statement of Trustees Responsibilities
