Fortunately, the significant growth of the membership over the last year will ensure that our income will at least match our expenditure in the financial period of 25/26. Planning permission is expected in the Summer of 2025 and, therefore, the associated costs will disappear.</p> <p>As referenced earlier the donation of a minibus has been a major boost to the charity, however it does place an additional burden on the club's finances as seen in the financial statement.</p>

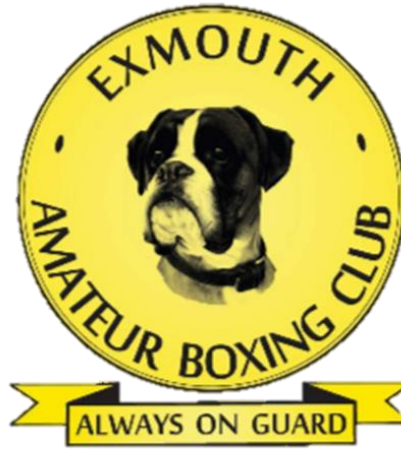
