This will enable the club to continue should there be a change in teams that the club operates and thus the impact on funds. • The new pitch on Shires Lane still needs funds in readiness to prepare this for eventual use. • The opportunity arose to regenerate an existing pitch to allow sole use by the younger age group teams, not having funds available would not have made this possible.
