Objectives & Activities

The charity's purpose is to advance the arts and education primarily through the means of teaching storytelling and other related arts.

Ghetto Film School educates and trains children/young people in the art of storytelling through a 30 month fellowship programme. Courses cover both the art and business of cinematic and episodic storytelling while preparing fellows to advance their education at top universities. The fellows programme is free of charge for all students, and features instruction from leading filmmakers and industry experts and visits to live sets and studios. Fellows screen their films at prestigious venues, complete employment readyship training and receive on-set job placements. Transport and meals are covered throughout.

Ghetto Film School supports its alumni and young professionals and encourages them to pursue a career in the creative industries – film, TV, advertising and tech. GFS LDN identifies, develops, and connects emerging talent with the resources they need to advance in their careers through access to custom support, curated job placement opportunities, and one-on-one career mentorship services.

The Ghetto Film School trustees have adhered to the guidance provided by the Charity Commission regarding public benefit.

Achievements & Performance

The charity provided a city-wide offering with its community members coming from over 18 different London boroughs including but not limited to Tower Hamlets, Southwark, Lambeth, Croydon, Haringey, Enfield, Ealing and Lewisham. The young people that engaged with the charity gained a level of training, education and development that prepares them for a creative career and sets them up for long term financial security and career advancement.

22 fellows received weekly one-on-one coaching sessions while searching for full time work, 20 received resume and cover letter support and participated in curriculum vitae clinics, mock interview seminars, and office assistant readyship training. Many fellows have already received a production job which has given them their first professional credit courtesy of Ghetto Film School relationships with creative industry colleagues.

Financial Review

As of the 30th April 2025, the trustees and the charity confirm that they end the year not holding any reserves. However, the charity is projecting reserves equalling three months expenses for the period ending 30th April 2026. The charity did not hold any reserves for the period ending 30th April 2025 because it had engaged two cohorts in this period and was serving upward of 40 young people. The trustees and charity remain confident about the charity's finances and direction moving forward.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Ghetto Film School Limited is a charitable company limited by guarantee and utilises its articles of association as a governing document. Trustee selection is led by existing trustees with trustees voting on nominated parties and whether they'd be a good fit the Ghetto Film School Limited board.



1. General Information

The Ghetto Film School Limited is a private company, limited by guarantee, incorporated in England & Wales, registered number 12578828. The registered office is 14 Farnborough Street, Farnborough, Hampshire, GU14 8AG.

2. Accounting Policies

2.1. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 section 1A Small Entities "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006.

2.2. Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of discounts and value added taxes. Turnover includes revenue earned from the sale of goods and from the rendering of services. Turnover is reduced for estimated customer returns, rebates and other similar allowances.

Sale of goods

Turnover from the sale of goods is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods has transferred to the buyer. This is usually at the point that the customer has signed for the delivery of the goods.

Rendering of services

Turnover from the rendering of services is recognised by reference to the stage of completion of the contract. The stage of completion of a contract is measured by comparing the costs incurred for work performed to date to the total estimated contract costs. Turnover is only recognised to the extent of recoverable expenses when the outcome of a contract cannot be estimated reliably.

2.3. Taxation

Income tax expense represents the sum of the tax currently payable and deferred tax.

The tax currently payable is based on taxable surplus for the year. Taxable surplus differs from surplus as reported in the statement of comprehensive income because of items of income or expense that are taxable or deductible in other years and items that are never taxable or deductible. The company's liability for current tax is calculated using tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

Deferred tax is recognised on timing differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable surplus. Deferred tax liabilities are generally recognised for all taxable timing differences. Deferred tax assets are generally recognised for all deductible temporary differences to the extent that it is probable that taxable surplus will be available against which those deductible timing differences can be utilised. The carrying amount of deferred tax assets is reviewed at the end of each reporting period and reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable surplus will be available to allow all or part of the asset to be recovered.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period in which the liability is settled or the asset realised, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period. Deferred tax liabilities are presented within provisions for liabilities and deferred tax assets within debtors. The measurement of deferred tax liabilities and assets reflect the tax consequences that would follow from the manner in which the Company expects, at the end of the reporting period, to recover or settle the carrying amount of its assets and liabilities.

Current and deferred tax are recognised in surplus or deficit for the year, except when they relate to items that are recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, in which case current and deferred tax are recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

Deferred tax liabilities are generally recognised for all taxable timing differences. Deferred tax assets are generally recognised for all deductible temporary differences to the extent that it is probable that taxable surplus will be available against which those deductible timing differences can be utilised. The carrying amount of deferred tax assets is reviewed at the end of each reporting period and reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable surplus will be available to allow all or part of the asset to be recovered.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period in which the liability is settled or the asset realised, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period. Deferred tax liabilities are presented within provisions for liabilities and deferred tax assets within debtors. The measurement of deferred tax liabilities and assets reflect the tax consequences that would follow from the manner in which the Company expects, at the end of the reporting period, to recover or settle the carrying amount of its assets and liabilities.

Current and deferred tax are recognised in surplus or deficit for the year, except when they relate to items that are recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, in which case current and deferred tax are recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.
