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



Two grants were approved for small UK registered non-profit organisations – the Rahela Trust and Omid International, both supporting Afghans in need.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The charity was established at the height of the exodus of Afghans fleeing the Taliban in August 2021 and came at a time when support was needed more than ever.

Thanks to generous donations from Mr Jalal Agha, the charity has been able to provide grants to 2 non-profit organisations in its first year of operation:

- Rahela Trust – we helped to fund their new Development Director role to enable the charity to continue to grow its university scholarship programme for disadvantaged Afghan women. Currently 14 women are being sponsored through university in Kabul, Helmand and Kandahar.
- Omid International – we provided funding to help them establish a new hub in Istanbul to develop employment opportunities for Afghan refugees. The hub has been successfully set up and now has 18 working there, mainly in media roles, offering a sustainable livelihood for displaced Afghans and their families.

One new Trustee - Polly Marsh - was appointed to the board as it was recognised that further diversification would be beneficial. Polly is a business owner, a Deputy Lieutenant for Somerset and a trustee for The Ulysses Trust with valuable experience on the grant making side of charitable activities. The board approved her appointment unanimously on 14/3/2021.


