The project offers a weekly Wednesday coffee morning with an optional lunch; there are occasional themed days and there are periodic outings (some destinations have been found to be more successful than others, and new venues are researched with careful consideration given to the demographics of the participants). The scheme is intended essentially to benefit the isolated, the lonely, the elderly and the vulnerable, all both able-bodied and disabled.

There is ongoing work to promote sport within the community to promote health and wellbeing. We wish to encourage walking football for men and women, children to play sport at all levels, football for adult women. A substantial growth in the town's population has brought forth an increasing number of children and women who wish to play football, and the charity continues to seek funding to facilitate this for all at all levels.

Additionally, during the financial year under review, the charity has sponsored the use of facilities to enable sports coaching for home-schooled children within the town of Brackley and the surrounding area.

The charity has again been successful in obtaining substantial funding from the National League Trust to underwrite the Saints Community Project as detailed in an earlier section. Additional grant applications have this year also proved more successful, and there have been two substantial donations to help funding.

The ongoing success of this project is evidenced by the increasing number of regular attendees who are elderly, lonely or isolated – or a combination of all three. Attendance at the Wednesday sessions is further boosted by the regular presence of local adults with learning disabilities who are supported through Solden Hill House care.

Additionally, the project manager has over the years established an excellent working relationship with many agencies meaning that the attendees benefit from regular advice and support from professionals such as local authority staff, social prescribers from GP surgeries, the police, schools and the local Mercedes Petronas business.

The project offers a weekly Wednesday coffee morning with an optional lunch; there are occasional themed days and there are periodic outings (this year the "regulars" have requested a visit to the Oxford Christmas Market for example). The scheme is intended essentially to benefit the isolated, the lonely, the elderly, all able-bodied and disabled.

Since the charity is in its early stages, there is ongoing work to promote sport within the community to promote health and wellbeing. We wish to encourage walking football for men and women, children to play sport at all levels, football for adult women. We are currently working up some pilot schemes so that we can assess the likelihood of a) the success of the project and b) obtaining funding when applications are made in order to continue these projects.
