- i. Enabling and promoting community participation in healthy recreation by providing facilities for the playing of association football and other sports capable of improving health (facilities being land and buildings) and organising sporting activities
- ii. Providing and assisting in the provision of facilities for recreation and other leisure time occupation of such persons who have

need for such facilities by reason of their age, infirmity, disablement, poverty or social and economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interest of social welfare and with the object of improving their conditions of life.

iii. To promote social inclusion for the public benefit by preventing people from becoming socially excluded, relieving the needs of those people who are socially excluded and assisting them to integrate into society by facilitating weekly meetings in a convivial atmosphere in order to meet others and enjoy others' company with the provision of a meal and occasional entertainment.

The principal funding by this charity since it was established has been to acquire funding to enable the Saints Community Project to revert to its pre-Covid activities and to build on its success, thus offering its benefits to an increased number of people. The project offers a weekly Wednesday coffee morning with an optional lunch; there are occasional themed days and there are periodic outings (this year the "regulars" have requested a visit to the Oxford Christmas Market for example). The scheme is intended essentially to benefit the isolated, the lonely, the elderly, all able-bodied and disabled.

Since the charity is in its early stages, there is ongoing work to promote sport within the community to promote health and wellbeing. We wish to encourage walking football for men and women, children to play sport at all levels, football for adult women. We are currently working up some pilot schemes so that we can assess the likelihood of a) the success of the project and b) obtaining funding when applications are made in order to continue these projects.

The charity has obtained substantial funding from the National League Trust to underwrite the Saints Community Project as detailed in an earlier section.

Although support was offered during lockdown, many of the former attendees have been reticent to emerge from their self-imposed isolation and health problems have often developed during that period. Whilst communication was maintained during lockdown with periodic doorstep visits and the provision of some home-cooked meals, it has been gratifying to note the gradual build-up of the regular attendees returning as their confidence grows and to see the arrival of more and more new faces.
