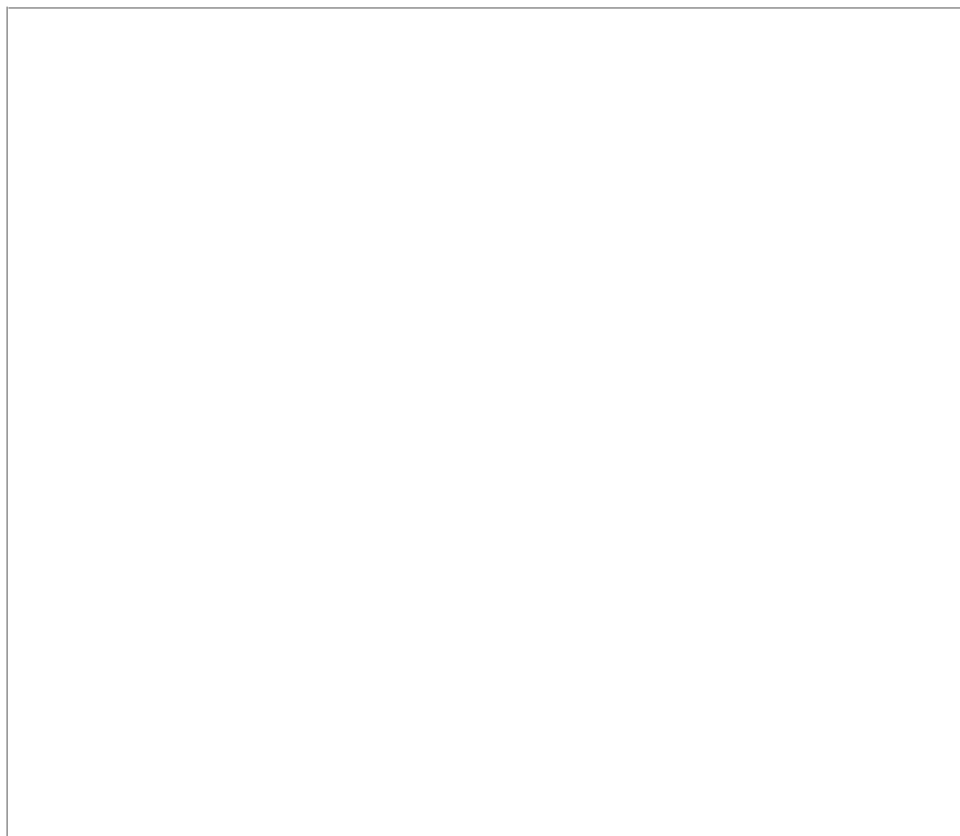
The organisation has a safeguarding policy in place which covers the duty on trustees for the protection of beneficiaries, staff, volunteers and others coming into contact with the organisation.

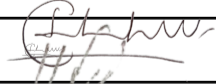
