**TRUSTEES' REPORTS  
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST JULY 2025**

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The Trustees present their annual report together with the financial statements of The RCCG Berea Believers' Fellowship West Midlands for the year ended 31st July 2025

The Trustees confirm that the annual report and financial statements of the charity comply with the current statutory requirements, the requirements of the charity's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in March 2005.

**STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT**

**a. CONSTITUTION**

The church is governed by the Memorandum and Articles incorporated 7th July 2021

**b. METHOD OF APPOINTMENT OR ELECTION OF TRUSTEES**

The management of the charity is the responsibility of the Trustees who are appointed and co-opted under the terms of the Trust deed.

**c. POLICIES ADOPTED FOR THE INDUCTION AND TRAINING OF TRUSTEES**

The induction process for any newly appointed member of the Trustees comprises an initial meeting with the Chair and other Trustees, followed by a series of short meetings with the Minister in Charge on the powers and responsibilities of the Trustees.

**d. ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE AND DECISION MAKING**

The church is organised so that the trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs. The day to day administration of the church is managed by the parish pastor and volunteers.

**e. RELATED PARTY RELATIONSHIPS**

Berea Believers' Fellowship West Midlands is a member of the Redeemed Christian Church of God (RCCG) which has parishes all over the world. The parish's relationship with RCCG and other parishes is governed by an "Agreement for Common Purposes".

**f. RISK MANAGEMENT**

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the charity, and are satisfied that systems and procedures are in place to mitigate our exposure to the major risks.

**g. GRANT MAKING POLICY**

The church supports visiting ministers of the gospel both within and outside the United Kingdom.

Support is also given to RCCG Central Office, World Evangelism Mission, Festival of Life and other RCCG programmes.

The church supports other charities and missionary that shares its objects in advancement of Christian faith and relief of poverty. The church gives occasional grants to congregational members who are in need.

The trustees have decided that at present, funds should be retained in bank. Any change in such banking should be agreed by the board. As far as possible, funds will be retained in interest bearing accounts.

The church works with vulnerable groups including children and make sure users are safe and protected from harm. Volunteers, employees and trustees have the right checks and assessments before they can work with a church. Find out how charities can protect their users. ##### **a. REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES**

The church undertook the following activities:

- Feeding those in need in the community.
- Ongoing weekly food share to the community
- Provision of transportation to and from place of worship for disadvantaged members of the community.
- Jointly organising seminars with other charities on effective parenting strategies and techniques for members of the community.

Seminars to sensitize our students community on life in the United Kingdom, the importance of facing their studies, avoiding plagiarism and balancing student, work and social life

- Assisting members of the community who are stranded to source living spaces.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

##### **a. RESERVES POLICY**

Members of the church have been generous this year. The statement of the financial activities shows net asset stand at £106,774 against the last year amount of £50,774.

The Trustees have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ('the free reserves') held by the church should be 3 months of annual expenditure. At this level, the trustees feel that they would be able to continue the current activities of the church in the event of a significant drop in funding.

##### **b. PRINCIPAL FUNDING**

This is provided mainly through voluntary tithes and offerings by the church members.

**INDEPENDENT EXAMINNERS REPORT  
FOR THE PERIOD August 2024 to July 2025**

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I report on the financial statements of RCCG Berea Believers Fellowship for the year ended 31 July 2025 which comprise the statement of financial activities, the balance sheet, and the related notes. These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out therein.

**Respective responsibilities of trustees and independent examiner**

As the charity's trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts, you consider that the audit requirement of section 43(2) of the Charities Act 1993 (the Act), as amended by s.28 of the Charities Act 2006 does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine accounts under section 43 of the Act, as amended, to follow procedures specified in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners under section 43(7)(b) of the Act, as amended, whether particular matters have come to my attention.

**Basis of independent examiner's statement**

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charities Commissioners.
