## **Report of the Trustees**

### **For the Period Ended 31st March 2024**

#### **Objects of the Charity**

The charity is a Church which is governed by a constitution and is constituted as a charitable incorporated organisation. The charity's principal objects, as set out in its governing document, are to advance the Christian faith for the benefit of the public.

#### **Summary of the Charity's Main Activities and Achievements**

The Trustees are aware of the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit in "The Advancement of Religion for the Public Benefit" and has regard to it in the administration of the Church.

The Church exists to:

- increase awareness of God's presence and to celebrate God's love;
- help people learn and grow as Christians, through mutual support and care; and
- be a good neighbour to people in need and challenge injustice.

The Church provides benefit to the public by:

- providing resources and facilities for the enjoyment of public worship, pastoral care and spiritual, moral and intellectual development, both for the congregation and for anyone else who wishes to benefit from what the Church offers.
- promoting Christian values and service by members of the congregation to the community, for the benefit of individuals and society as a whole.
- engaging with the general public, and in particular with the disadvantaged, the sick, the elderly and the young. This can be measured and evidenced through increased social integration and pastoral care delivered at the point of need.
- improving understanding of the values relating to community engagement, community cohesion and providing a bridge between diverse groups.
- The beneficiaries are the general public, and the public valuation of the benefits can be evidenced through attendance at public worship, participation in Church governance and willingness to support the Church through contributions.

The trustees consider that for these reasons the Church meets the public benefit requirements. No Trustee receives remuneration, reward or other private benefit for carrying out their Trustee responsibility.

This is the Church's second year as a charity - the Church operates a busy schedule and Enterprise House is in use most days of the week. Weekly attendance and membership have increased during this year. We have benefitted from a move to larger premises and our presence and profile have increased across the local area through social media and networking. Our website and social media posts have all been maintained with the objective of letting everyone know, and be encouraged by, news and pictures of our activities.

Having a larger space has allowed a number of events to be held at the Church throughout the year. These events have raised the profile of the Church and have included:-

- a Women's Health Seminar
- Limitless Youth
- Life Changing Kingdom Men's Conference
- Women Prayer Conference

The Church acquired a minibus in November 2023 which has been useful for outreach activities.

### **Financial Review**

This is the charity's first full year of operation and the results cover the year ended 31 March 2024. The charity's main source of funds received this year was from offerings and donations - no grants were applied for or received during the year. During the year, offerings and donations received totalled £53,536. The offerings and donations received have been made available without restriction as to their usage. At the period end the unrestricted funds held by the charity which can be used for any charitable purpose was £1,825.

### **Reserves Policy**

Freely available reserves are a pool of unapplied resources available to meet future demands on the Church's resources. This is "general purpose" money that can be spent on any of the purposes of the charity. The Trustees are committed to holding sufficient reserves to ensure the Church can meet its general business commitments.

### **Governance**

There must be at least three charity trustees. If the number falls below the minimum the remaining trustee(s) may act only to call a meeting of the charity trustees or appoint a new charity trustee. There is no maximum number of charity trustees that may be appointed to the CIO.

### **Risk Statement**

The charity is exposed to various risks - be they operational, financial or reputational. The trustees review the charity's activities regularly to identify significant risks and, where possible, they take appropriate measures to mitigate those risks.

### **Responsibilities of Trustees**

The trustees are required to prepare financial statements for each accounting year which record the receipts and payments of the charity for the year. We are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable us to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2022.

We also have a responsibility to safeguard the assets of the charity and to take reasonable steps to prevent fraud or any other irregularities.

As the trustees of the charity you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the 2011 Act').



## **Notes to the Accounts**

### **For the Year Ended 31st March 2024**

#### **1. Accounting Policies**

The accounts have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis and comprise a statement that shows the charity's receipts and payments, a statement that summarises the charity's assets and liabilities and related notes. The accountancy profession have determined that only accounts prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards present a 'true and fair' view and, as these receipts and payments accounts have not (and cannot) be prepared in accordance with accounting standards, these accounts do not present (and are not intended to present) a 'true and fair' view of the charity's financial activities and state of affairs.

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity. Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes. Restricted funds are donations which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors; they include donations received from appeals for specific activities or projects.

#### **2. Tangible Fixed Assets**

The charity purchased a minibus in November 2023 - depreciation will be calculated to write off it's cost less any residual value in equal instalments over it's useful economic life. The annual rate in use is 50% per annum but no depreciation has been applied in the current year as the minibus was purchased towards the end of the financial year.

The objects of Kingdom Life International Church are to advance the Christian faith for the benefit of the public in accordance with the statements of belief appearing in the schedule.

The Trustees are aware of the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit in "The Advancement of Religion for the Public Benefit" and has regard to it in the administration of the Church.

No Trustee receives remuneration, reward or other private benefit for carrying out their Trustee responsibility.

### **Worship Services**

The Church holds worship services online via Zoom and in person at rented premises located at Enterprise House, Salter Street, Preston. This includes a Sunday service at 11.00am and Sunday School for younger attendees with free refreshments available for all.

These services provide a time for fellowship and an opportunity to advance Christian beliefs with the public. As an inclusive Church, holding free social events have enabled us to educate and advance our religious beliefs by engaging with the wider local community.

A daily prayer devotional is also held online via the platform of the DeleTalks Media Network.

In addition to worship services, the Church also holds a wide range of activities to advance our religious beliefs. Activities are open to all and allow us to share our religious beliefs within the local community. They include:

### **Weekly Prayer & Bible Study Meetings**

Prayer and Bible Study meetings provide a fellowship group for individuals seeking to enhance their religious education. Targeted group sessions provide an opportunity for attendees to openly ask questions, develop their Christian knowledge in a safe space and engage with others in a positive environment.

### **Youth Activities**

In addition to the religious context of our work with the youth ministry, the Church also holds activities for younger members and visitors. These include quizzes, days trips, games/movie nights and sports activities. This enables young people to engage with others within the community and develop friendships.

### **Family Activities**

The church hosts free leisure activities for families within the local community as part of its activities programme. Activities are held throughout the year and include a Summer Fun Day and a music concert in December. They provide social interaction and inclusion within the community.

### **Community Choir**

The Church holds community choir sessions at Farringdon Park Community Centre. This engagement allows attendees to develop friendships with individuals from a diverse range of backgrounds which broadens their social network and helps improve social cohesion.

### **English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)**

ESOL sessions are held at the Church on Saturdays. The sessions help attendees to improve their use and understanding of the English language and provide a social space to meet new people while developing skills to assist with employment and education.

**Outreach**

We visit older people at Preston Care Home in Fulwood to provide religious guidance and companionship. The Church also engages in a range of activities to alleviate poverty – we support the homeless via the distribution of food and sleeping bags and assist families in need by delivering food parcels from a local foodbank.

**Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year**

The Kingdom Life International Church Preston first began as a small gathering of faithful Christians who were meeting weekly online to pray and study God's Word together. As the meetings began to flourish and grow, we felt that it was time to go public and commence congregational Sunday worship services. This is our first year as a charity and we have seen weekly attendance and membership steadily grow due to interest from local people.

We acquired a small space on the first floor of a building located on North Road, Preston but as the numbers began to increase, there was a need to move into a bigger space. The Church was able to secure larger premises at Enterprise House, Salter Street, Preston in January 2023. This has been a major achievement for the Church and allows us to accommodate an ever-increasing number of members and attendees. There has been a gradual increase in donations, tithes and offerings throughout the year.

Having a range of religious activities has enabled us to share our religious practice with members and non-members within the local community. Attendees of our events have stated that the friendly environment allows them to develop their understanding of religion and the spiritual benefit that can be achieved through religious belief.

Community choir sessions have been well attended and provide an opportunity for attendees to learn and/or improve their singing skills alongside others in the local community.

All aspects of Church life aim to promote opportunities to put faith into action by service to the Church and the local community.
