Para 1.20	<p>In the year to 30th June 2022 :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 2CK has handled 23 referrals from a range of sources. - 16 referrals have been matched to befrienders, as scheme members. - 178 home visits and 62 phone calls were made. - 20 volunteers were recruited, trained and ready. <p>With the result that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 13 scheme members reported improved mental/ emotional health - 7 scheme members recorded messages of good news, and - 5 volunteers also recorded good news messages. <p>The wider benefits are reflected in 15 media references to 2CK's work, including appreciative comments from CA12 members of the public, and consistent levels of referral from families, friends and professional agencies (Social Care, NHS etc.)</p>

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

