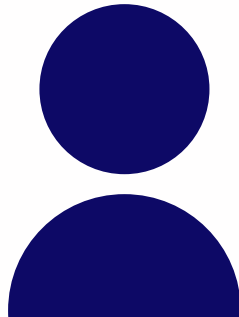
Message from The Board of Trustees

- ✔ Kutu Chand was the nickname of Mofur Uddin. He started from humble beginnings and became an orphan at a very young age. Much of his early life was lived in poverty. Things took a positive turn for him when he was given the opportunity to migrate to the UK.
- ✔ Life in the UK was difficult for him as he worked most of his working life in factories and sometimes worked 7 days a week. Through his hard work he was able to change the financial situation of his family.
- ✔ He was known among the community in the UK as well as in Bangladesh for his generosity and willingness to help the poor and needy. He was diagnosed with lung cancer in 2016 and sadly passed away in 2019. Kutu Chand Foundation was started by us, his family, after his death as we wanted to continue his legacy of charity. It was registered with the Charity Commission around two years after his death.
- ✔ It has now been over 3 years since we set up Kutu Chand Foundation and with your duas and support, this last year has been the most successful.
- ✔ On top of this, we have also increased the number of individuals we are financially sponsoring and supporting.

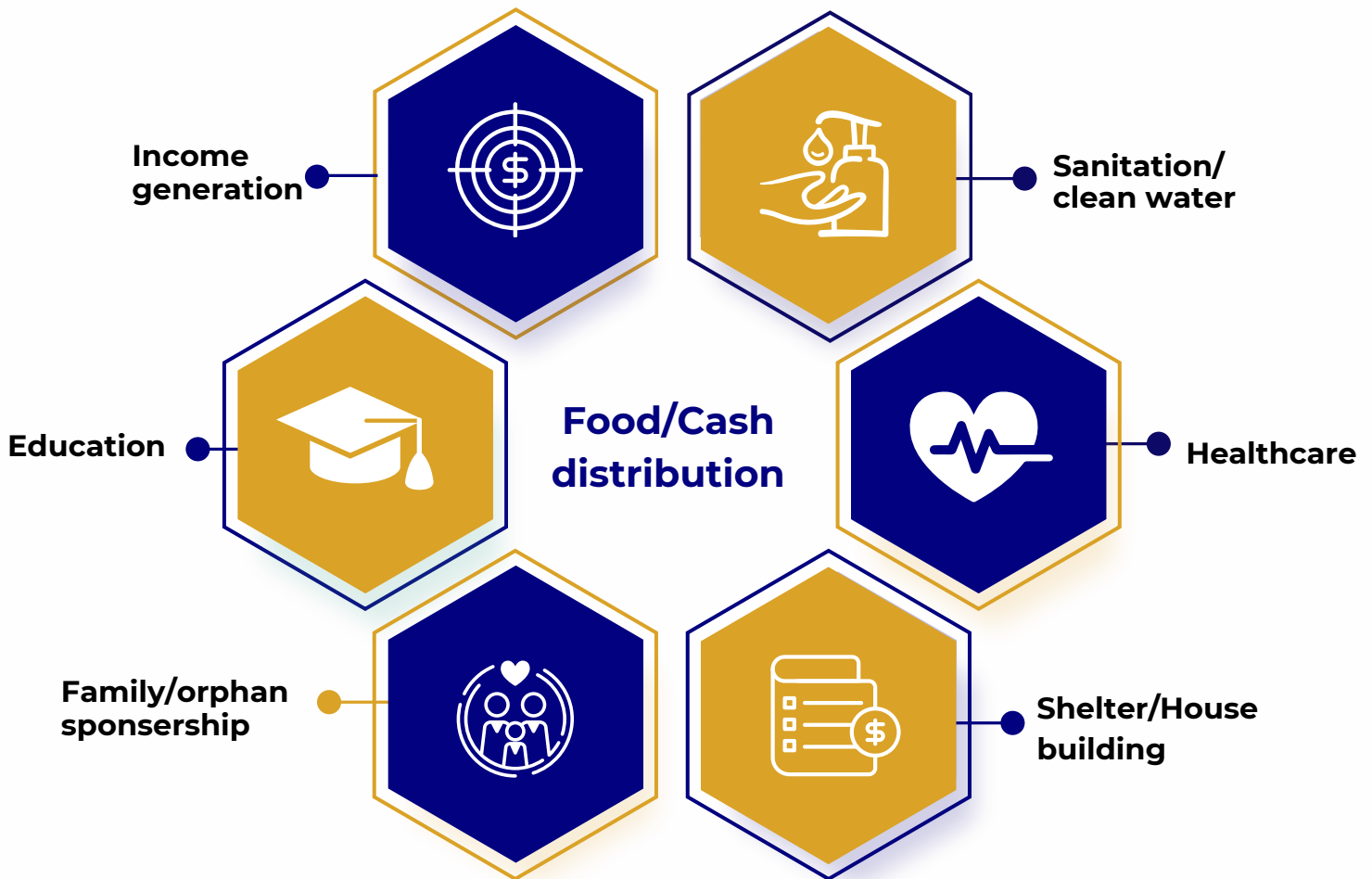

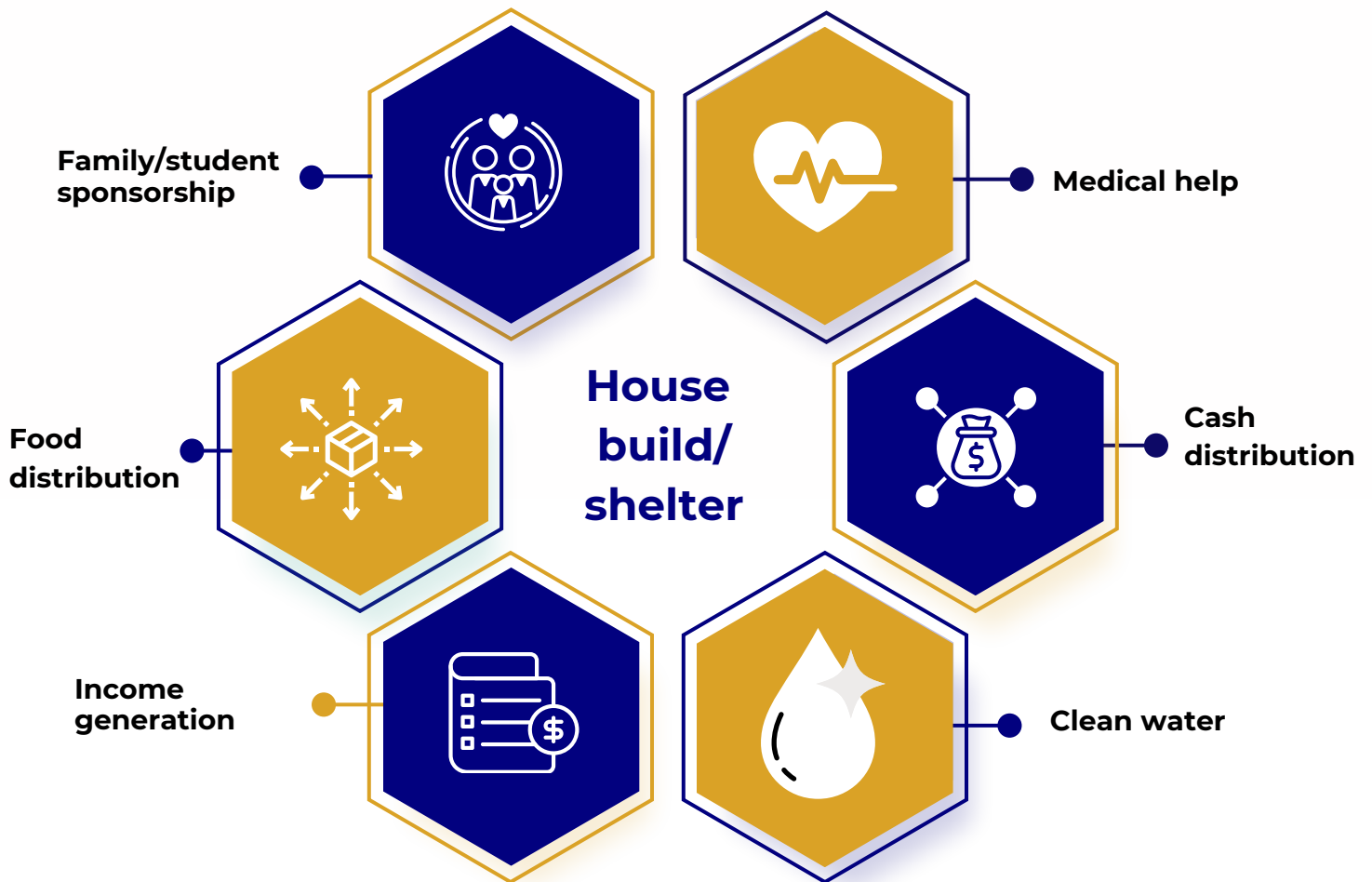

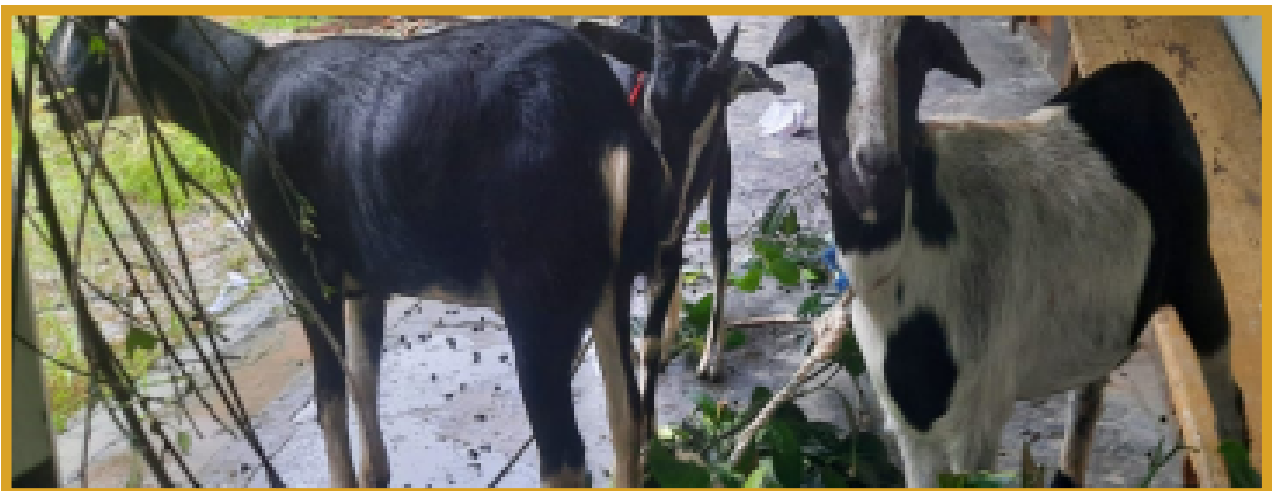
Projects Delivered





Food Distribution

- ✓ Kutu Chand Foundation donated cows and goats to the local orphanage, which were used to feed hundreds of orphan children.



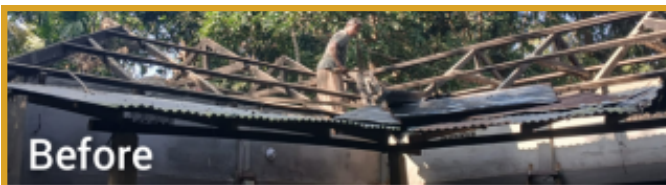
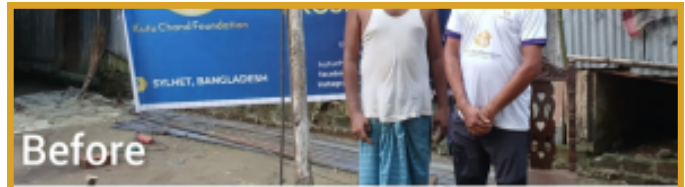
Cash Distribution

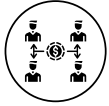

Message from The Board of Trustees

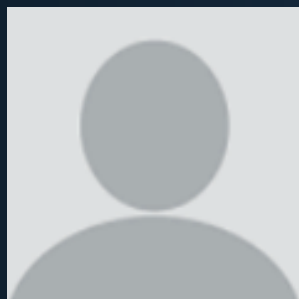

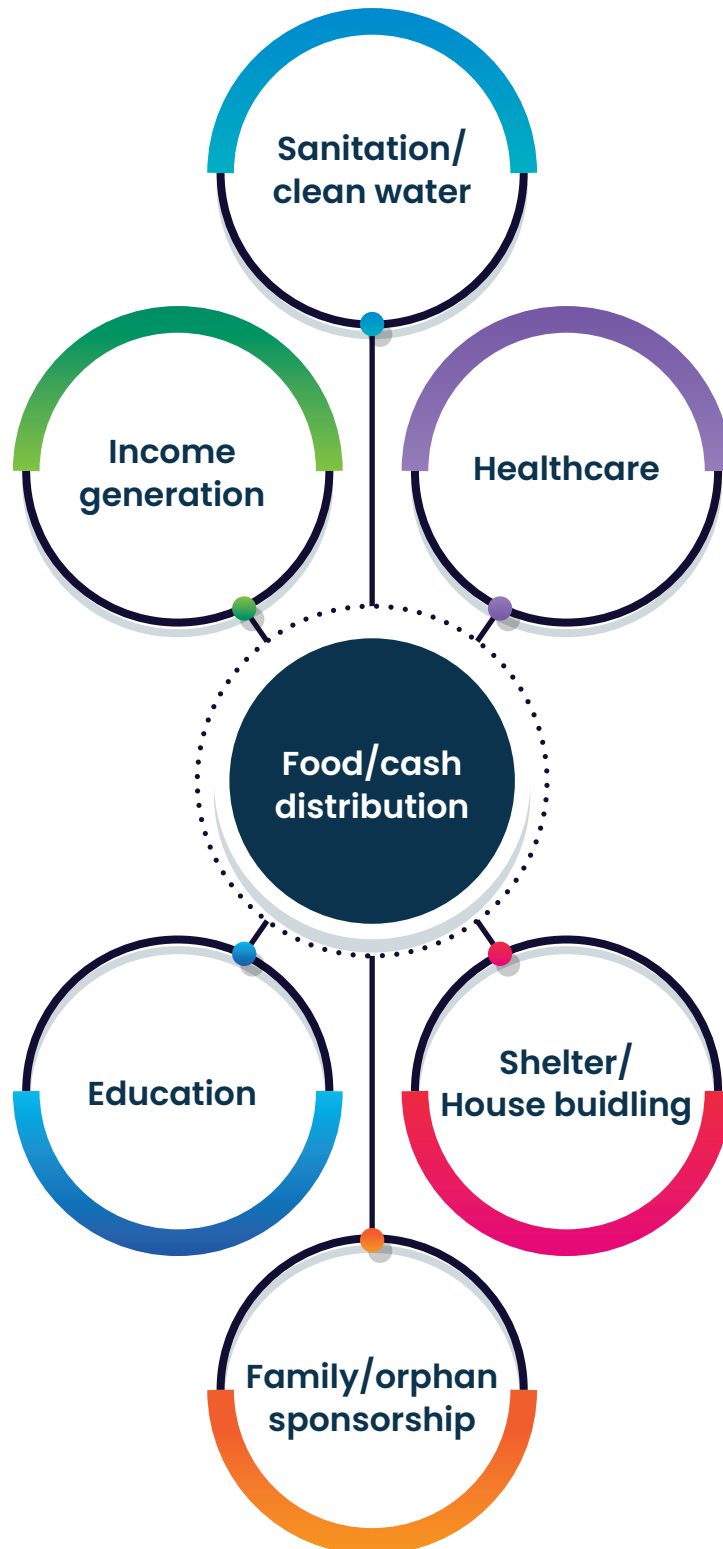

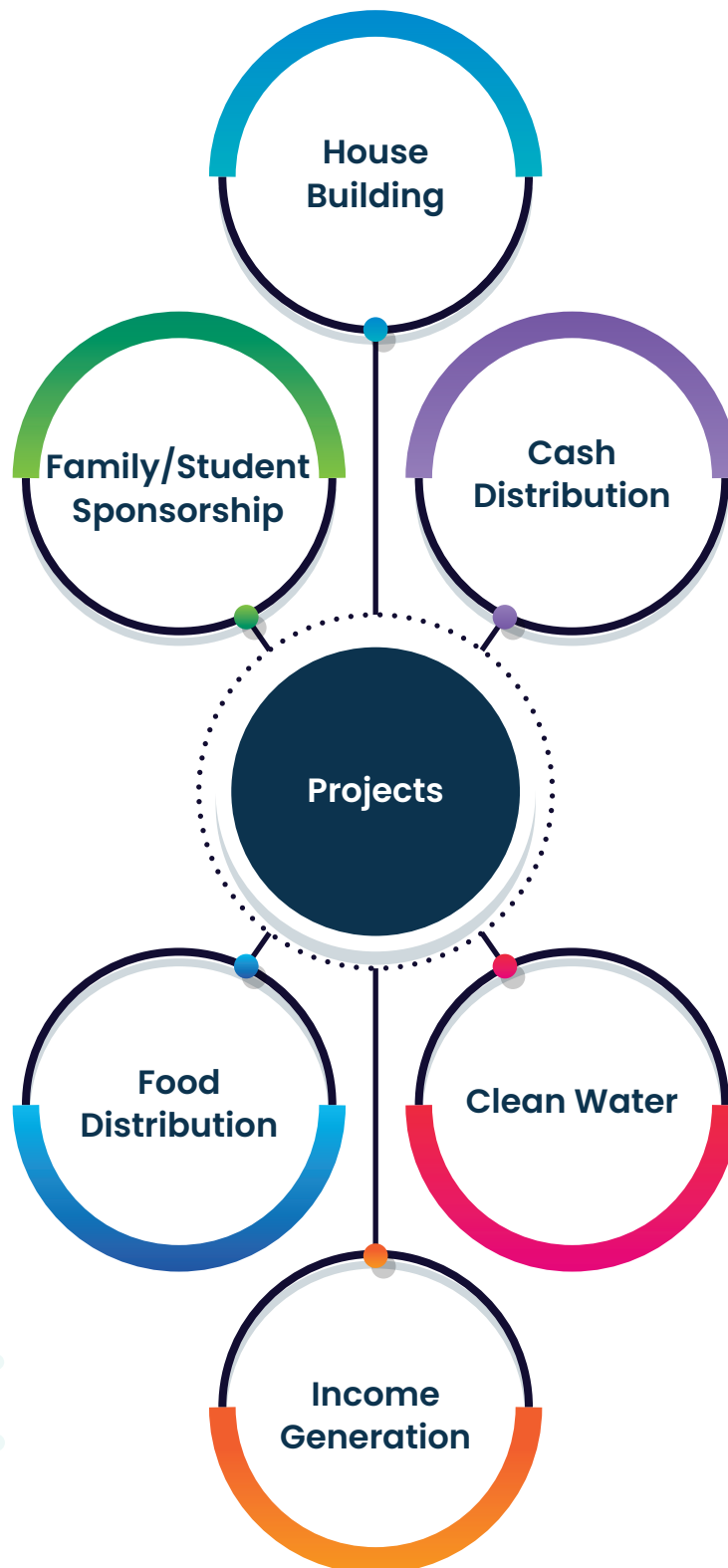
