We provided outreach services in Manchester City Centre three nights a week, serving between 100 and 150 hot meals each evening. In addition to meals, we offer sandwiches, hot and cold beverages, clothing, and toiletries. Our impact has doubled compared to the previous year. Moreover, we have successfully assisted some of our service users in securing temporary or permanent housing, a significant accomplishment celebrated by everyone at Cold Hands Warm Hearts.

We successfully raised £20,553 through a mix of charitable fundraisers, donations, and grants. During the same period, our expenditures totaled around £13,116, which was allocated to essential supplies for our nightly outreach services. This included cooking ingredients, toiletries, equipment, and emergency accommodation and food parcels. We sadly lost everything we owned in a storage fire six months into the year, but the community has come together and helped us raise an amazing amount of funding to help us build back up to where we are today.



