STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document and status

The charity is governed by its Trust Deed and was registered with the Charity Commission on **18 November 2021**.

How the charity is constituted

The charity is an incorporated organisation whose only voting members are its charity trustees.

Appointment of trustees

New trustees are appointed by resolution at a meeting of the charity trustees and serve for a term of three years. There must be a minimum of three trustees at all times.

The trustees meet regularly to review strategy, ministry activity, safeguarding, financial oversight and compliance with Charity Commission guidance.

OBJECTIVES AND AIMS

Objects

The charity's objects, as set out in its governing document, are:

“To advance the Christian faith both in Great Britain and overseas, for the benefit of the public, in accordance with the beliefs found in the Christian Bible.”

PUBLIC BENEFIT

The trustees have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and are satisfied that the charity's activities during the year have furthered its charitable purposes for the benefit of the public.

Public benefit is delivered through:

- The **advancement of religion**, via teaching, worship, prayer, evangelism and mission
- **Education and training**, particularly leadership development, discipleship and biblical teaching
- **Community benefit**, through pastoral support, prayer ministry, accessible online resources, and in-person gatherings
- **Widened access**, by providing large volumes of free content online and subsidised training globally

All activities are open to the public, either freely or at modest cost, and are designed to support spiritual wellbeing, personal development and leadership capacity within churches and Christian communities.

SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES

The TRIBE is a UK-based Christian charity dedicated to fostering spiritual growth, leadership development and community among Christians in the UK and internationally. We equip individuals, churches and leadership teams through teaching, worship, training and mission activity.

The TRIBE operates as both:

- A **global online learning and worship community**, providing resources both online and in-person to believers and leaders.
- A **travelling and relational ministry**, investing in churches, leaders and regions through in-person mission and training.

Our activities include online courses, daily devotionals, worship gatherings, leadership mentoring, media ministry, books and resources, and strategic partnerships with other Christian organisations.

Founded by Rev. Jarrod Cooper, an experienced church minister and author, The TRIBE exists to help believers live faith-filled, Spirit-led lives and to support churches in thriving within contemporary culture.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Main Achievements During the Year

a) Missions, Church and Leadership Investment

During the year, The TRIBE held **missions and leadership investment visits** supporting churches and leadership teams across the UK and internationally, including:

Since **April 2024**, ministry activity has extended into **France, Germany, Switzerland and South Africa**. In the UK we've supported churches and leaders in York, Stoke-on-Trent, Wales, Cheshire, Skipton, Market Rasen, Louth, Lincoln, Leicester, Scarborough, Sheffield, Birmingham, Eastbourne, Derby, Normanton, Bradford and London, with some locations receiving multiple visits.

These missions focused on:

- Teaching and preaching
- Worship and prayer ministry
- Leadership development and mentoring
- Pastoral encouragement, coaching and prophetic ministry

b) Reach and Engagement

Since April 2024:

- We have sent out over **900 physical products**, (books, journals, apparel etc).
- Approximately **5,000 individuals** were trained or ministered to **in person**
- Over **35,000 individuals** were inspired by our free **daily devotionals & blogs** through over **100,00 visits**.
- Around **12,000 people** joined our free **online worship livestreams**
- **Hundreds of thousands** were reached through **television, radio, podcasts and other media**

These activities provide wide public access to Christian teaching, encouragement and worship at no cost to the majority of participants.

c) The TRIBE Spirit & Word Online School

The TRIBE's online school continues to be a cornerstone of our charitable activity.

By year-end:

- The School currently has **66 active students**/members, with **over 400** having studied with us since its inception. Around 20 of our current students are enjoying free access due to personal circumstances/as gifts-in-kind to support them.
- **872 teaching modules** are now available on our learning platform
- Delivered across **115 structured courses**
- With students participating **from around the world**

The school equips believers and leaders in:

- Biblical teaching
- Leadership development
- Worship ministry
- Healing and prophetic ministry
- Practical Christian living

A significant proportion of this training is provided **free or subsidised**, ensuring accessibility regardless of financial means.

d) Leadership Training and Equipping

A core focus of the charity is the training and support of Christian leaders. This includes:

- One-to-one mentoring
- Team training
- Online leadership cohorts
- Strategic advice and pastoral support

This work strengthens churches, protects leadership wellbeing, and contributes positively to the sustainability of local Christian communities.

e) Online Worship and Devotional Life

The TRIBE continues to provide:

- Regular online worship experiences
- Daily devotional teaching
- Prayer and ministry moments

These resources offer spiritual support, encouragement and connection for individuals who may otherwise be isolated or unable to attend church in person.

f) Media Ministry

The charity continues to reach large audiences through:

- Legacy media (TV & Radio)
- Online video platforms
- Podcasts and written teaching

Through these channels, the charity advances the Christian faith and provides accessible teaching and encouragement to the wider public.

g) Partnerships and Collaboration

During the year, The TRIBE collaborated with several Christian organisations, including:

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

Looking ahead, the trustees anticipate the following developments:

The Development of the TRIBE Circuit

The TRIBE Circuit represents a new way of building relationship, distinct from a traditional network or itinerant ministry. Rather than brief or transactional engagement, the Circuit is based on **ongoing, deeper relational connection**.

This involves regularly touring and returning to a defined group of churches, developing long-term relationships that allow us to become a trusted and embedded presence within each context. Over time, we seek to become part of the life of the church — contributing to its leadership culture, sharing values, and walking alongside leaders in a meaningful and sustained way.

Through the TRIBE Circuit, we offer extended relational support to church and ministry leaders, providing encouragement, wisdom, and continuity that goes beyond one-off visits or events.

Raising a new Worshipping Generation

We are planning, praying into, and preparing for the development of a worship ministry that will cultivate environments where the presence and glory of God are encountered and released through worship, prayer, creativity, and proclamation.

Working with our partners, we intend to host worship gatherings, symposiums, and regional events that will bring together worshippers, intercessors, creatives, and leaders from across the nation. These gatherings will be designed to facilitate powerful moments of worship and intercession, while also equipping and inspiring participants for ongoing ministry and mission.

A central focus will be the intentional raising and resourcing of the next generation of worship leaders, prayer leaders, musicians, artists, authors, and creative communicators. Through mentoring, training, and platforming emerging voices, we hope to encourage new expressions of worship and creativity that will serve the Church and engage the wider culture.

We are also believing for large-scale gatherings that will fill auditoriums with bands of musicians, artists, and communicators united in purpose — creating space for evangelism, artistic expression, and sustained intercession. We pray that these gatherings will contribute to spiritual renewal and revival, releasing God's glory into churches, cities, and regions.

Growth in the Tribe student body.

We want to continue to see the learning platform grow its students body globally, offering a version of all the above, to those who want to grow via online learning and the unrestricted access and pace that can offer. Our intention is that growth in the TRIBE Circuit and worship ministry, will funnel some into deeper connection with our online offering.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves Policy

The trustees are responsible for ensuring that the charity maintains sufficient financial resources to support its ongoing activities and to meet its legal and contractual obligations as they fall due.

The trustees aim to ensure that all funds, both restricted and unrestricted, remain in credit at all times. Expenditure is only authorised where sufficient funds are available within the relevant fund category to meet that expenditure.

Restricted funds are applied solely for the purposes for which they were given and in accordance with any conditions imposed by the donor. Where restricted funds are received, the trustees take reasonable steps to ensure that such funds are utilised in a timely and appropriate manner for their intended purpose.

The trustees have determined that it is prudent for the charity to hold a level of unrestricted reserves sufficient to cover approximately **three months of core operating costs**, including governance, management, and other unavoidable commitments. This level of reserves is intended to provide financial stability, manage short-term cash flow fluctuations, and allow time to respond to unforeseen events or changes in funding.

At the reporting date, the charity's unrestricted reserves total **£500**. The trustees consider this level of reserves in the context of the charity's current size, income, and expenditure and will continue to review and build reserves where possible.

The level of reserves is monitored throughout the year and formally reviewed by the trustees at least annually, taking into account the charity's financial position, future plans, risks, and anticipated income and expenditure.

Sources of funding

The charity's sources of funding are donations received from individuals and organisations, training products purchased, honorariums for speaking engagements, mission/travel expenses, and subscriptions to the learning community.



New trustees are appointed by a resolution passed at a meeting of the charity trustees, and serve for a term of 3 years. There must be at least 3 trustees at any one time.

OBJECTIVES AND AIMS

Objects

The charity's objects, as set out in its governing document are:

“To advance the Christian faith both in Great Britain and overseas, for the benefit of the public in accordance with the beliefs found in the Christian Bible”.

Summary of Activities

The TRIBE is a UK-based organization dedicated to fostering spiritual growth, leadership development, and community building among Christians worldwide. Registered as a charity (no. 1196644), we focus on equipping individuals and churches through teaching, worship, and missions. The TRIBE operates primarily as an online worship and learning community, offering a range of resources, including Bible courses, leadership training, and prophetic teachings.

We provide both free and subscription-based content through our platform. Our free worship community includes live worship events, interactive prayer sessions, and other spiritually enriching activities available via YouTube and in-person. For deeper engagement, the subscription-based TRIBE Learning Community offers access to over 800 teaching modules on leadership, theology, worship, and more, effectively functioning as an accessible online Bible school. Members also benefit from exclusive Zoom sessions, e-books, and tailored leadership resources.

Founded by experienced church minister Rev. Jarrod Cooper, our mission also extends globally, supporting ministries and fostering revival through in-person travelling ministry and innovative digital outreach. Cooper's vision is to help believers lead impactful lives centred on God's presence and to equip churches to thrive in contemporary contexts. Alongside his work with The TRIBE, Cooper leads Revive, a church network involved in church, missions and humanitarian efforts.





The trustees are aware of the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit; the trustees have due regard to this guidance in planning and carrying out the charity's activities.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Main achievements of the Charity 2023-24

- a) **The Tribe Online Learning Community** – At the heart of the TRIBE ministry, is our unique global online learning community. Our latest invitations for this describes it thus:

Join The Tribe: Your Online Learning Community for Growth and Transformation

-  Discover Community: Connect with like-minded believers passionate about spiritual growth and practical life transformation.
 -  Endless Learning: Gain access to inspiring courses, teachings, and resources designed to deepen your faith and equip you for your God-given purpose.
 -  Led by Jarrod Cooper: Learn from a dynamic U.K. voice in spiritual teaching, blending biblical wisdom with Spirit-led insights.
 -  Anytime, Anywhere: Accessible online—grow at your own pace, no matter where you are.
- b) **Tribe Community Online Progress** The Tribe Zone now includes 842 lessons, grouped in 106 courses. The online learning environment for leaders and learners, has now taught over 400 students globally since its inception, with teaching, wisdom, support and encouragement – with generous amounts of free training, support and learning offered for free to many participants globally, alongside the paid students. There are currently 70 actively enrolled in The TRIBE, many returning for a second and third year of education. In recent times we have added outstanding teaching from external respected teachers like Tommy Tenney, Dan McCollam, Bethany Hicks, Roma Waterman, David and Marion Cooper and others.
- c) **Leadership Development** The most intense level of church leadership team investment we offer in-person and through our online learning platform, (Tier 3: GLT+), has impacted several churches internationally (UK, South Africa and Gibraltar), with Zoom meetings, one to one mentoring, advice and team development times, plus numerous one on one meetings with leaders for personal investment, networking and support.
- d) **The Tribe Online Worship Community** – Our newly launched online Worship Community now has 1492 members globally, and content was enjoyed this year by a further 70K on YouTube and 150K on Facebook. The weekly online presence is now being enhance by an in-person service in the café of Let Loose Adventure Park, proving a valuable source of rest, healing, ministry and support for many.
- e) **World Missions** – In this period we have ministered to around 3000 in-person and face to face, plus 200K online, seeing significant healings, moves of God’s Spirit and life transformations . Our main speaker and trainer, Jarrod Cooper, has invested training and support into Christian, church and charity leaders, meeting groups in Scarborough (x2), Halifax (x2) Bradford, Dudley (x2), Leicester (x2), Salford (x2), Manchester, Preston, alongside speaking at the UK’s main worship conference in Eastbourne, plus investment into leaders at UCB Media Stoke, the annual gathering of European Latvian Leaders, a men’s meetings in York, church away weekends in Spain and Horsham, plus in depth leadership investment into churches in Scarborough, Lincoln, Gibraltar and Johannesburg.
- f) **Media Television & radio opportunities** with UCB Media, BBC and GOD TV were enjoyed this year, plus we broadcast an interview with author David Hazeldine, about his experiences of “Locked-In Syndrome”, and how to overcome severe trauma. Our free Podcasts of worship and teaching inspire thousands for free, while over 27,000 individuals were inspired by our blog posts of teaching, prophecy and training.
- g) **Books and Products** – In this period we gifted over 150 books to individuals globally and Victoria Cooper also launched a TRIBE Self-Care Journal & Devotional to add to our already growing library of book resources listed here:

- h) **Youth Alpha** Jarrod & Vicky Cooper led around 20 youth through two Youth Alpha courses in partnership with Revive Church, which was heaps of fun and fruitfulness and has stirred thoughts on how we reach the next generation with TRIBE resources and support.
- i) **Compassion** Our compassion focus, supporting the work of Oasis de Esperance in Colombia, who educate, feed and give medical care to some of the poorest children of Colombia, is having a lasting effect and we've gifted £685.61 to this and other charitable causes.
- j) **Partnerships – Our partnerships with Revive Church, and organisations like UCB Media & Oasis De Esperanza** continue to prove vital collaboration in our mission, for support, platform, reach and advice.
- k) **300 Shields** – Sensing the need to increase prayer coverage and connection, our intercession group "300 Shields" now has 142 praying members (We need to enrol 158 more to reach 300!).

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

As we look forwards, we see the next developments of The TRIBE to include:

- a) **Network** – We want to continue to develop Tier 3 of the TRIBE online community, into more of a fully functioning network and support for leaders, in partnership with Revive Church.
- b) **Summits and Conferences** – We have long hoped to start significant gatherings in places around the world where we have close connections – the hope is to commence this in 2025.
- c) **Books and Resources** – New ideas for books and online resources continue to flow, and we hope to increase our resources output from the TRIBE, thus increasing ministry impact and income, keeping the charity buoyant.
- d) **Worship Nights and Gatherings** – Developing Worship Nights into moments of powerful impact and encounter, in East Yorkshire and elsewhere around the world is one of key aims.

- e) **Next Generation** – We are considering ways to develop a new generation of media ministry and worship ministry youth, who can carry and develop the work in the years to come.
- f) **Partnership** – We would like to increase the partner base giving, both regular and one-off, to draw in more active lives who would like to contribute to our charitable aims.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves Policy

The trustees policy on reserves is to ensure that all funds, both restricted and unrestricted, remain positive at all times. Expenditure will only take place if there are sufficient funds, in the appropriate fund, to support that expenditure.

Restricted funds are only expended in the manner for which the funds were given. If restricted funds are received, the trustees take steps to use those funds expediently for the specified purpose.

It is the trustees policy that the charity hold in reserve enough unrestricted funds to meet all our legal, ongoing and outgoing commitments for 3 months. This policy will be reviewed annually.

"To advance the Christian faith both in Great Britain and overseas, for the benefit of the public in accordance with the beliefs found in the Christian Bible"

Activities

The charity activities can be summarised as training, teaching and supporting Christians, and in particular Christian and charity leaders, in order to influence the world for the better, through the widest possible work of the church globally. This is achieved through online learning communities, networking, global and local missions, leadership health sessions, mental resilience support, training, events, summits, conferences, collaborations, teaching, equipping and encouraging Christian leaders, through speaking, preaching, ministry, writings, courses, broadcasts, TV, radio, podcasts, interviews, online resources, worship and prayer experiences, personal support to leadership teams and one on one mentoring.

The trustees are aware of the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit; the trustees have due regard to this guidance in planning and carrying out the charity's activities.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Main achievements of the Charity

During this first year of operations, the main achievements of the charity included:

- The Tribe online learning community – our online learning environment for leaders and learners, has now supported over 400 leaders globally since its recent inception, with teaching, wisdom, support and encouragement – with generous amounts of training, support and learning offered for free to participants globally.
- The most intense level of church leadership team support we offer through our online learning platform, Tier 3, has impacted four churches in this year, in Johannesburg, Lincoln, Hexham and Barnsley, with Zoom meetings, one to one mentoring, advice and team development times.
- The Tribe online worship community – In this period we launched a "free to join" global online worship community, offering a worship experience, packed with encouragement and

support, which has been enjoyed by tens of thousands globally, with notes of thanks and fruit from around the world.

- Our Key speaker and trainer, Jarrod Cooper, has invested training and support into Christian, church and charity leaders, meeting groups in Barnsley, Retford, Scarborough, Harrogate, Rotherham, Sheffield, Nottingham, London, Havercroft, Newcastle, Leicester – and more recently Johannesburg and Gibraltar, as the international work begins to re-open post-covid restrictions.
- Our compassion aim, supporting the work of Oasis de Esperance in Colombia, who educate, feed and give medical care to some of the poorest children of Colombia, is having a lasting effect.
- Our work with Broadcasters UCB Media, providing training, consultancy, staff support and broadcast content has continued in this year, and we continue to enjoy a strong partnership with Revive Church Hull, locally.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves Policy

The trustees policy on reserves is to ensure that all funds, both restricted and unrestricted, remain positive at all times. Expenditure will only take place if there are sufficient funds, in the appropriate fund, to support that expenditure.

Restricted funds are only expended in the manner for which the funds were given. If restricted funds are received, the trustees take steps to use those funds expediently for the specified purpose.


It is the trustees policy that the charity hold in reserve enough unrestricted funds to meet all our legal, ongoing and outgoing commitments for 3 months. This policy will be reviewed annually.


Sources of funding

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements:

The financial statements have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis.

Receipts

Receipts consist of monetary donations, expense reimbursements and the purchase of training materials.

Payments

Payments consist of amounts expended in relation to the charity's work in furtherance of its objects.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds are funds whose manner of expenditure is subject to conditions set out by the donor.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds which have been earmarked for a specific purpose by the trustees.

As the charity's income in this year is under £25,000, an audit and independent examination is not required.

Throughout the year to 5 April 2023, there were no restricted nor designated funds.
