The prevention or relief of poverty amongst homeless people in the Republic of South Africa and other parts of the World as the trustees may decide by providing grants to charities or other organisations working to prevent or relieve poverty, in particular but not exclusively by improving the conditions of people who are homeless, finding pathways for people out of homelessness and the provision of food, clothing and mental health support

The advancement of the Christian faith for the benefit of the public in the Republic of South Africa and other parts of the World as the trustees may decide by providing grants to charities or other organisations who advance the Christian faith, in particular but not exclusively by providing opportunities for the homeless community and those who work to support them to engage in prayer, Bible study and religious education.

#### Structure, Governance and Management

U-Turn Outreach is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, registered with the Charities Commission on 26 November 2021. The Constitution provides for a minimum of 3 trustees who are elected by all members at the AGM. If there is a vacancy between AGMs, Charity Trustees can appoint a new Trustee until the next AGM. Elected trustees serve for 3 years after which they may put themselves forward for re-election. The majority of trustees must reside in England and Wales.

#### Review of the year

The focus throughout the year was continuing to put the building blocks in place for the organisation to be able to achieve its charitable purpose, with the main focus being the need to open a new bank account. This was achieved late in the year and we were once again able to receive donations.

Some Income was then received from individual donations and funds have started to be built up.

The Trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the Charity Commission's public benefit guidance. They have ensured that U-turn Outreach works towards its public benefit purposes.



The focus throughout the year was continuing to put the building blocks in place for the organisation to be able to achieve its charitable purpose. Governance structures were strengthened through developing a range of policies such as Financial Policies and Procedures, Safeguarding, Whistleblowing and Risk Management Policies.

Income was received from individual donations, and funds built up to date were disbursed to a registered Charity in South Africa; this enabled them to support 807 people with 20,443 meals and 20 people were assisted into a shelter and rehab programme.

Trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the Charity Commission's public benefit guidance. They have ensured that U-turn Outreach works towards its public benefit purposes.



Deficit for the year: £4,902

The deficit arose due to the distribution of donation and grant income received in this and previous years. All funds held were distributed on the closure of our bank account, pending the opening of a new Charity account, hence the reduction of reserves to nil at the year end. These will be built up in the coming year to the level required to provide the level of working capital required to protect the continuity of our core work. We do not currently have paid staff or other regular operating expenses so this level will be modest as we seek to responsibly maximise distributions.

Policy on grant making	Para 1.38	<p>U-turn Outreach has established its grant making policy to achieve its objects for the public benefit to provide relief of poverty among homeless people in South Africa and support the advancement of the Christian faith. Currently it is estimated there are 200,000 homeless people in South Africa.</p> <p>The beneficiary organisation must be a registered non-profit organisation in South Africa that is working from a developmental approach to overcome homelessness. The beneficiary organisation must also support the advancement of the Christian faith, in particular but not exclusively by providing opportunities for the homeless community and those who work to support them to engage in prayer, Bible study and religious education.</p> <p>U-turn Outreach will build partnerships with organisations working on homelessness in South Africa and will invite them to apply for funding. To access funding, the beneficiary organisation needs to complete an application form outlining the use of the funds. Requests will be reviewed by the U-turn Outreach board on a quarterly basis.</p> <p>U-turn Outreach does not accept unsolicited donation requests from organisations it does not already have a partnership with and may not respond to any such request received. U-turn Outreach reserves the right to undertake background and due diligence checks on any new organisation before funding is provided.</p>
