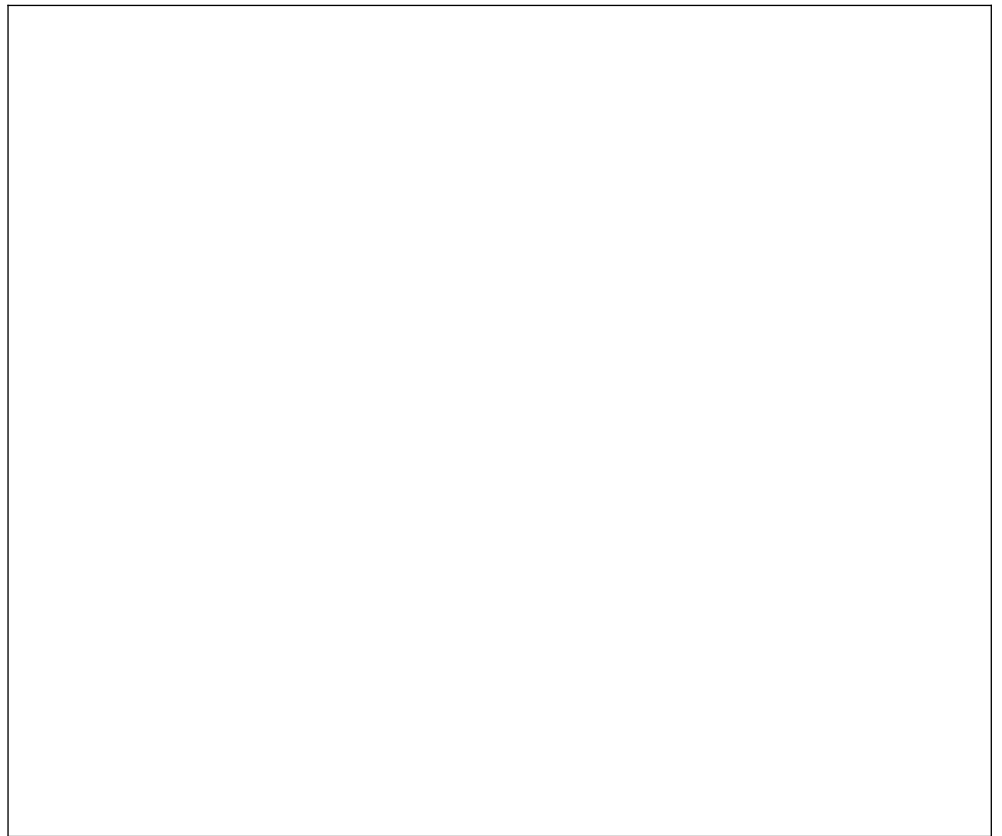
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We offer weekly craft and skill building courses for anybody that is at a loose end, struggling with mental health issues, in isolation or loneliness.

We have an impact on those who are struggling with less opportunities in life and those who lack life skills, experience and guidance by offering taster courses in expenditure and financial knowledge, curriculum and arts and crafts. We also support with the development of individual capabilities, competences, skills and understanding. We also offer support with CV, job searches and additional training courses to further clients skills.

We offer the provision of items such as food, furniture, clothing, toiletries, white goods, heating appliances and bedding. We offer advice and guidance and also advocate in meetings for clients that need extra support or clients that struggle to express themselves correctly and help them understand the outcome of a meeting and what is expected of them. We offer support with financial hardship helping with hospital transport travel expenses to earn their living, utility top ups e.g. Electric, gas and mobile phone top ups. 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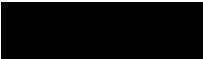
