East Greenwich Legal Advice Clinic Trustees' Annual Report

The trustees present their report for the year ended 31st December 2024

Objectives and Activities

As stated in our governing document the primary objective of the CIO is the relief of financial hardship by the provision of free legal advice and assistance to persons resident or based in a South East London postcode who, through lack of means, would otherwise be unable to obtain such advice.

Main Activities

- We provide advice on various areas of law, principally: Family, Immigration, Welfare Benefits, Property (including Wills and Probate), Civil Litigation and Housing.
- We invite enquiries from individuals, charities and community groups, although due to our limited resources we will prioritise assistance to individuals. All of our advisers are volunteers, as are the other individuals who help to facilitate our clinic sessions.

Structure, Governance and Management

EGLAC was launched as part of National Pro Bono Week in November 2017 and was formally registered as a charity on 10th December 2021. We are governed by the regulations set out in the Foundation Model constitution and run by a voluntary Board of Trustees.

Trustees are encouraged to take an active role in enabling the organisation to fulfil its objectives. This allows trustees to get a clear understanding of what the charity does and the complexity involved in co-ordinating activities to respond to the needs of those who are struggling with the consequences of financial insecurity and debt. In selecting individuals for appointment as trustees, regard is given to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the charity. All of the current trustees are experienced lawyers and four are also advisers, or former advisers, for the clinic.

The Board meets formally six times a year.

Public Benefit

In reviewing the scope of the activities delivered by the charity the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and are satisfied that the purposes for which the charity has been established and the activities undertaken demonstrate how we meet the requirements of the test.

Policies and Procedures

EGLAC is a signatory to the Law Society's Pro Bono Charter and we strive to achieve best practice in our legal advice and assistance for individuals and organisations who cannot afford access to justice. We have policies and procedures in place to ensure that our practices are compliant with quality standards.

Risk Assessment

The trustees have a procedure in place to regularly review the risks – financial and non-financial – facing the organisation and the trustees are satisfied that appropriate measures to mitigate risk are in place. Internal controls over all forms of commitment and expenditure continue to be refined to improve efficiency. Processes are in place to ensure that performance is monitored and that appropriate management information is prepared and reviewed regularly, by both the executive management and the Board. A programme of monitoring is in place, derived from a comprehensive risk management review.

Activities and achievements

Objectives for year 2024

Our main objectives for the year were to:

- Develop relationships with law firms with a view to running further clinics;
- Obtain further funding for the Clinic Director role;
- Involve volunteers in more fundraising events; and
- Continue to develop relationships with other advice and support agencies.

During 2024, EGLAC fielded 1,124 enquiries from members of the public. Of these, 489 people were signposted to other services and 485 were given free legal advice on a wide range of issues by our volunteer legal advisers.

Our objective to develop relationships with law firms with a view to running further clinics has been achieved. We now have two monthly remote clinics run in partnership with Birketts LLP and McDermott Will & Schulte. Further funding for the Clinic Director role has been obtained, principally through the National Lottery Community Fund. We involved more volunteers in fundraising events by taking part in the London Legal Walk in June 2024. In addition, several of our volunteers took part in running events during 2024 to raise funds for EGLAC, namely the London Landmarks Half-Marathon, the Brighton marathon and The Big Half. We continued to develop relationships with other advice and support agencies

Objectives for the coming year

Our objectives for 2025 are to:

- Increase the number of people we are helping with advice and signposting to meet the increase in demand;
- Streamline our response to enquiries as far as we can;
- Recruit some new volunteers; and
- Obtain further funding to make EGLAC more sustainable long term.

Financial Review

All funds raised by EGLAC are detailed in the accounts at the end of this report. The accounts provide a summary of financial activity over the last year. Funds are used to achieve the objectives summarised above and to develop EGLAC for the benefit of the

community it serves.

Funds raised do not profit the trustees who form the organisation's management committee. No portion is paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profit to the charity's trustees.

Fundraising

We have continued to develop our fundraising programme. We use financial information and project plans to help strategise this. We operate a rolling programme of fundraising. This includes grant applications and fundraising events.

Reserves policy

The trustees have again reviewed the reserves requirement in line with the guidance issued by the Charity Commission and have reaffirmed that 3 months' running costs should be set aside or designated to safeguard activities in the event of delays in receipt of grants. The trustees will continue to review the appropriate level for the reserves in the coming year.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities and Corporate Governance

The trustees are responsible for their annual report and for the preparation of financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the incoming resources and application of the resources of the charity during the year, and of the state of affairs at the end of the financial year. Our main objectives for the year were to:

- *Streamline the clinic's processes, led by the new Clinic Director;*
- *Obtain funding with a view to making the clinic sustainable in the long run, and to fund the role of the Clinic Director;*
- *Recruit some new volunteer lawyers so the clinic can help more clinics; and*
- *Develop relationships with other local agencies.*

During 2023, EGLAC fielded 775 enquiries from members of the public. Of these, 319 people were signposted to other services and 276 were given free legal advice on a wide range of issues by our volunteer legal advisers.

Our objective to streamline the clinic's processes has been achieved. The clinic's various policies have been reviewed and updated, data protection measures have been updated, and basic safeguarding training has been created for all the volunteers. Funding has been obtained to fund the role of the Clinic Director for a further 12 months. Several new volunteer advisers have been recruited. Relationships with agencies such as Plumstead Community Law Centre, Christians Against Poverty (Greenwich) and Citizens Advice Greenwich have been developed.

Activities and achievements

Objectives for year 2022

Our main objectives for the year were to:

- Advise as many clients as possible, given the limited resources of the clinic and the recent restraints caused by the Covid-19 pandemic; and
- Continue to advise clients remotely in appropriate cases as well as offering in-person appointments at Christ Church once a fortnight.

During 2022, EGLAC fielded 478 enquiries from members of the public. Of these, 145 people were signposted to other services and 120 were given free legal advice on a wide range of issues by our volunteer legal advisers.

EGLAC obtained an offer of funding from the Royal Borough of Greenwich of £6,000 (received in 2023) and recruited a part-time Clinic Director, to start end January 2023. The role involves reviewing, supplementing and streamlining existing policies and procedures.

Objectives for the coming year

Our objectives for 2023 are to:

- Led by our Clinic Director to streamline the clinic's processes;
- Obtain funding with a view to making the clinic sustainable in the long run, and to fund the recruitment of the Clinic Director;
- Recruit some new volunteer lawyers so the clinic can help more clients; and
- Develop relationships with other local agencies.

Financial Review –

All funds raised by EGLAC are detailed in the accounts at the end of this report. The accounts provide a summary of financial activity over the last year. Funds are used to achieve the objectives summarised above and to develop EGLAC for the benefit of the community it serves.

Funds raised do not profit the Trustees who form the organisation's management committee. No portion is paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise by way of profit to the charity's Trustees.

Fundraising

We have continued to develop our fundraising programme. We use financial information and project plans to help strategize this. We operate a rolling programme of fundraising. This includes grant applications, fundraising events and appeals for support from local individuals and churches.

Reserves policy

The trustees have again reviewed the reserves requirement in line with the guidance issued by the Charity Commission and have reaffirmed that 3 months running costs should be set aside or designated to safeguard activities in the event of delays in receipt of grants. As this is our first year of operation we will review the appropriate level for the reserves in the coming year.

Statement of Trustees Responsibilities and corporate governance

The trustees are responsible for their annual report and for the preparation of financial statements for each financial year, which give a true and fair view of the incoming resources and application of the resources of the charity during the year, and of the state of affairs at the end of the financial year. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- Ensure that suitable accounting policies are established and applied consistently;

East Greenwich Legal Advice Clinic Trustees' Annual Report

The trustees present their report for the year ended 31st December 2022

Objectives and Activities

As stated in our governing document the primary objective of the CIO is the relief of financial hardship by the provision of free legal advice and assistance to persons resident or based in a South East London Postcode who, through lack of means, would otherwise be unable to obtain such advice.

Main Activities

- We provide advice on various areas of law, principally: Family, Immigration, Welfare Benefits, Property (including Wills and Probate), Civil Litigation, Housing, Community Care, Contract and small businesses.
- We invite enquiries from individuals, charities and community groups, although due to our limited resources we will prioritise assistance to individuals. All of our advisers are volunteers, as are the other individuals who help to facilitate our clinic sessions.

Structure, governance and Management

EGLAC was launched as part of National Pro Bono Week in November 2017 and was formally registered as a charity on 10th December 2021. We are governed by the regulations set out in the Foundation Model constitution and run by a voluntary Board of Trustees.

Trustees are encouraged to take an active role in enabling the organisation to fulfil its objectives. This allows trustees to get a clear understanding of what the charity does and the complexity involved in co-ordinating activities to respond to the needs of those who are struggling with the consequences of financial insecurity and debt. In selecting individuals for appointment as trustees, regard is given to the skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective administration of the charity.

The Board meets formally six times a year.

Public Benefit

In reviewing the scope of the activities delivered by the charity the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit and are satisfied that the purposes for which the charity has been established and the activities undertaken demonstrate how we meet the requirements of the test.

Policies and Procedures

EGLAC is now a signatory to the Law Society's Pro Bono Charter and we strive to achieve best practice in our legal advice and assistance for individuals and organisations who cannot afford access to justice. We have policies and procedures in place to ensure that our practices are compliant with quality standards.

Risk Assessment

The Trustees have a procedure in place to regularly review the risks – financial and non-financial – facing the organisation and the trustees are satisfied that appropriate measures to mitigate risk are in place. Internal controls over all forms of commitment and expenditure continue to be refined to improve efficiency. Processes are in place to ensure that performance is monitored and that appropriate management information is prepared and reviewed regularly, by both the executive management and the Board. A programme of monitoring is in place, derived from a comprehensive risk management review.

- Make judgements and estimates which are reasonable and prudent;
- State whether the applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended accounting practice have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements and
- Prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume the charity will continue operations

The trustees have overall responsibility for ensuring that the charity has appropriate systems and controls, financial and otherwise. They are also responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and for their proper application, as required by charity law, and hence for taking reasonable steps for prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities and to provide reasonable assurance that:

- The charity is operating efficiently and effectively
- All assets are safeguarded against unauthorised use or disposition and are properly applied
- Proper records are maintained and financial information used within the charity, or for publication, is reliable;
- The charity complies with relevant laws and regulations
