## About Our Charity's Work

Our charity is dedicated to supporting disadvantaged children and young people by providing access to enriching holiday camps and clubs. We specifically focus on families on low incomes, ensuring that children and young people who may otherwise miss out on such opportunities can participate in safe, fun, and educational activities during school holidays. In addition to our camps and clubs, we offer small grants to individuals, enabling them to access physical activity opportunities that would otherwise be out of reach due to financial constraints.

Through our programmes, we aim to foster inclusion, improve well-being, and help build confidence and resilience among the young people we support. Our activities are designed to be both enjoyable and developmental, encouraging participation in sports, arts, and team-building exercises. We also work closely with families, schools, and community partners to identify those most in need and to maximise the impact of our support.

## Where Our Money Comes From

- **Small Grants:** Providing direct financial assistance to disadvantaged individuals, enabling access to sports clubs, classes, and other physical activities.
- **Fundraising Events:** Covering costs associated with organising and running community fundraising events, which are essential for sustaining our income and outreach.
