However, we have been unable to hold any significant events due to budget constraints. These events are typically designed to enhance the relationships between children and parents in the community through meaningful social interactions.

Achievements against objectives set	Para 1.41	GCM continues to promote the Christian faith through the regular Church Service on Sunday, Bible Study/Teaching every Tuesday, Prayer meeting every day at 6pm, and evangelism every month. GCM also offer food every week to members and the community.
Performance of fundraising activities against objectives set	Para 1.41	Due to our understanding of the economic challenges in the community. The church has not held a fundraising event but relies on donations (Tithes/Offerings) from members to support its activities. To ensure the church could meet its outreach objectives, a vehicle was purchased. The outlay of £5947.25 reduced the balance of the church account at the end of the 2025 financial year.
