During the reporting period, the charity focused particularly on:

- Supporting children and young people with disabilities and additional needs
- Providing inclusive and accessible community facilities
- Promoting volunteering and community participation
- Strengthening partnership working to deliver services for public benefit

### ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

A key achievement during the year was the installation of a dedicated sensory room within Glenside Community Hall. This has enabled the charity to better support children with sensory and developmental needs, providing a safe and inclusive environment for families.

The charity strengthened partnership working with organisations including Torfaen Play Service, enabling the delivery of inclusive play sessions, respite activities and alternative education support.

Volunteers continued to play a vital role in managing and developing the community hall and supporting activities. The trustees record their sincere thanks for their commitment.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

At the end of the financial period, the charity held total funds of £43,971.56, of which £25,000 is held as designated reserves. The trustees consider this level of reserves appropriate.

The charity has worked extremely well to support residents

The Charity have supported a local community facility, working in partnership with community members, and facilitating the development of the premises that focuses on children and young people with disabilities and more complex needs. The facility also hosts a parenting group that makes use of services and organisations supporting the early years and promotes the growth of friendship groups and supporting parenting. We are working in partnership with Torfaen Play Service, who have utilised the venue to support disability groups, vulnerable children and linking with children and young person services. We have also accessed a community resistance grant for the installation of Sola Panels to create greener, cleaner and a more sustainable energy source for the community hall, the grant is from local government. We continue to promote the charity's purposes through developing Glenside Community Hall, working in partnership, and promoting opportunities for local people.

The Charity has also worked in partnership to deliver weekend respite for children with additional needs, a young carers group, a venue for alternative education, the charity relies on volunteers to develop these opportunities and manage Glenside Community Hall.

we have been working towards our charitable outcomes of providing good quality information advice, as well as promoting activities for the public benefit, by creating sustainable streams of funding to develop Glenside Community Hall, improve resources, deliver opportunities, Providing information and advice from the charity.

### **Achievements and Performance**

The charity has worked extremely well to support residents

The Charity have supported a local community facility, working in partnership with community members, and facilitating the development of the premises that focuses on children and young people with disabilities and more complex needs. The facility also hosts a parenting group that makes use of services and organisations supporting the early years and promotes the growth of friendship groups and supporting parenting. We accessed a grant for the purpose of making safe and upgrading the facilities kitchen, so that food and snacks could be prepared to encourage health eating within the groups. We worked in partnership providing guidance on growing the group and supporting families. In doing so we have been working to the charities outcomes and benefitting the public, that promotes appropriate play, education, and care facilities.

The Charity have also piloted a parent and toddler group in another community venue, this time supporting community volunteers to set up their own group, and following this pilot, the group are now running sustainably, creating enough funds to pay for the hire of the venue, equipment to run the sessions and have access to information and advice from the charity. In doing so, we have

been working towards our charitable outcomes of providing good quality information advice, as well as promoting activities for the public benefit.

All trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

Over the last year the trustees for Glenside Community Association have been working hard to ensure all policies are up to date, as well as focusing on the maintenance and development of our community hall. Volunteers have worked hard to help the charity develop an identity, supporting each other and working as part of a team to support our communities. 
