The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Objects of Connect Foundation are for the public benefit, including the prevention or relief of poverty by providing grants, items and services to individuals in need and/or charities or other organisations working to prevent or relieve poverty, and the relief of unemployment in such ways as the Charity Trustees may from time to time decide, including assistance to find employment.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The charity has worked hard to implement its vision 'to seek the wellbeing of North Lincolnshire'.

Our largest project is Scunthorpe Foodbank, which uses food and financial donations to help feed local people who find themselves in need.

This project has relied on strong partnerships with referral agencies and our local Citizens Advice Bureau to ensure that we are able to be of maximum benefit for those accessing our services.

We also operate a project called 'Change for Change', which encourages people to contribute their loose and spare change, which is then collected and used to help people in need by relieving their immediate concerns.

This year we have particularly been able to use these funds to help people with their rising utility costs.

During the previous 12 months we have done significant work through a project called 'Cooking Together', as we provide cooking equipment and training to local people.

We have also seen 'The Way', a project focused on individuals from the SEND community, thrive and grow, particularly through the popular puppet club for young people.

Public Benefit

The Trustees have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and complied with section 17 (5) of the 2011 Charities Act when reviewing the aims and objectives prior to planning and developing activities.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

Budgets are prepared on an annual basis by the trustees, who also carry out regular reviews of income and expenditure.

Those responsible for procurement of goods and services are required to ensure that best value is achieved, and that preferred suppliers are reviewed on a regular basis.

Reserves policy

The reserves policy of Connect Foundation is that each fund within the charity should reserve enough funds to cover any ongoing committed costs and then an additional 3 months worth of running costs.

At the end of this financial year the charity has a small deficit in terms of unrestricted funds. Looking forward we have agreed a change in our financial practices with all of the projects within the charity, which will see them each make a small percentage contribution on income each year for a management fee which will be unrestricted. This will not only help with the deficit in unrestricted funds, but help to support the growth of Connect Foundation in the future.

FUTURE PLANS

The Way Community is growing significantly and has been able to access increased funding for further development in the year ahead.

In the year ahead we will also continue working with other local partners to explore the possibilities of repurposing a local premises as a cafe space for community use.

Basis of preparing the financial statements

7. CHARITY RECONSTRUCTION

From 1 April 2022 the activities and restricted funds relating to Scunthorpe Foodbank and Change for Change were transferred by the charitable incorporated organisation Connect Church (North Lincs) to Connect Foundation (North Lincs).

The minister of Connect Church (North Lincs) is automatically a Charity Trustee of Connect Foundation, and the members of Connect Church (North Lincs) shall nominate candidates for election as Charity Trustees to the board of Connect Foundation when appropriate.

On 1st April 2022 £3,050 was transferred from Connect Church (North Lincs) to Connect Foundation (North Lincs) held in relation to Change for Change and £73,859 was transferred from Connect Church (North Lincs) to Connect Foundation (North Lincs) held in relation to Scunthorpe Foodbank.
